Title of Unit: Exploring Identity, Culture, and Community

Title of Lesson(s):

• Days 10-14: Creative Expression of Individual Identity and Culture

Subject Area: English

Grade Level: 11th

Approximate Time for Do Lesson(s): 50 Minute Lessons

Lesson Overview:

This lesson aims to deepen students' understanding of themselves within the context of their community and culture.
