**Bonner, Patrick J.** – Patrick J. Bonner, Beaver Island's celebrated Irish fiddler, died October 26<sup>th</sup> at Leelanau Memorial Hospital in Northport where he had been a patient for 10 days. Funeral services were held Monday, October 29<sup>th</sup>, at Holy Cross Church, the Rev. Herbert Graf, OFM, officiating. Burial was in Holy Cross Cemetery.

Mr. Bonner was born on Beaver Island on November 7<sup>th</sup>, 1882, and learned to play the fiddle as a boy, picking up and memorizing the Irish tunes brought to the New World by his forebears and his friends and neighbors on the Island. His ear for the lilting Irish melodies was so acute that the Music Department at the University of Michigan invited him to come to Ann Arbor several years ago to make tapes of his Irish music for the University's archives. Mr. Bonner played on an ancient violin dating from the early 1700's with a Stradivari label pasted inside the case. However, the instrument was never verified as a genuine Stradivarius.

As a young man, Mr. Bonner became good friends with the late "Dr. Feodor Protar", the Russian nobleman who migrated to Beaver Island about the turn of the century by way of Chicago. Although Dr. Protar had no formal medical training he was interested in the healing arts and served as the Island's doctor until his death in 1927. Mr. Bonner, who farmed across the road from the Protar home, became the unofficial custodian of the doctor's property, taking Island visitors through the log home – which has been kept just as it was when the doctor was alive – and escorting them to Dr. Protar's fieldstone tomb nearby.

In 1916, Mr. Bonner was married to the former Rose Boyle. Although the Bonners spent several winters in Charlevoix in recent years, they always returned to their Island home on the first boat every spring. Mr. Bonner retained a lively interest in music until recent years, playing the fiddle for weddings, anniversaries and celebration of all kinds.

He is survived by his widow, a daughter, Mrs. Ronald (Mary) Antrim of Grand Rapids; two sons, John P. of Milford, Conn., and Robert H. of Lansing; nine grand-children; and 12 great-grandchildren.

The rosary service was held at the Bonner home Sunday evening, October 28<sup>th</sup>. Winchester Funeral Home in Charlevoix was in charge of arrangements.

At her birthday, she was presented the Key to St. Pete, and received letters from the President and the Governor (she had a great love of politics, possibly inherited from her grandfather, St. James Supervisor Sam Dunleavy, and was very active.) Her brother Peter visited her daily; she was still the one consulted by her family whenever they had a problem. Known for her great wisdom and common sense, she never complained; her positive attitude was an inspiration to all those she meets.

Violet McCafferty was born the fourteenth day of September 1904, to Francis and Nellie McCafferty on their farm. At the age of sixteen, she graduated with three others in her class, then went off to a school on the mainland, called Normal School in Charlevoix.

After one year she received her teaching certificate. Her first job was on a nearby island teaching the American Indians in a one room school – all through the eighth grades, there were about twenty Indians in the school. When she was at home for Christmas she returned to the mainland, with the closest point of land an Indian settlement called Cross Village. When Violet was about to leave the Island, her cousin, Carl Left, who happened to be sick the day she was leaving, lent his horse Star to her older brother and another man. They got Carl's horse and cutter to take the mail from the Island to the mainland; Violet was the only passenger. She had on a big sheepskin coat that belonged to her cousin, plus blankets and heated bricks at Violet's feet to keep her warm.

Well, they were clipping along pretty good when the horse stepped in a crack in the cracked ice, and broke his leg. They had to put the horse out of its misery, and start walking. They had six or seven miles to go when the Indians knew something was wrong because the horse could find his own way, as he carried the mail every week. The Indians started out with their horses to look for them. They finally found them and took them and the mail to the Village. They were on land about an hour when a blizzard came up; without the Indians, it could have been a real disaster.

In 1930, while home for a visit, Violet met her husband to be, James Custer. He was vacationing on Beaver Island from Detroit, Michigan. They fell in love and were married the next year.

They lived in Detroit several years, then moved to the Philadelphia area, where her husband was the President of the Automotive Aeronautical Engineers, a monthly paper consisting of several hundred pages.

They moved to Saint Petersburg in 1957, and bought an apartment complex at Seventh Street and Seventh Avenue. They named it the Topaz Apartments. Her husband Jim died over 20 years ago and Violet took over running the apartments until she moved into the Princess Martha Hotel three years ago.

**Gallagher, Neil D.** - Charlevoix Sentinel, Thursday, July 10, 1913, Beaver Island News: The remains of Neil D. Gallagher, first officer on Car Ferry No 18, who was drowned at Ludington on the night of June 20, arrived here last week for burial.

The funeral was held from Holy Cross Church, where, on account of the popularity of the young man, a large concourse of people had gathered to witness the ceremonies.

It is not known how the accident occurred, but the supposition is that after the car ferry had finished loading that night, Mr. Gallagher, who had been ashore, returned to the boat, and in some manner slipped and fell into the water while going aboard. He was not missed until the boat was well on her way to Milwaukee.

The fact did not worry the captain any, imagining that the boat had pulled out without Gallagher, and that he would show up again on his return to Ludington. On making inquiries the captain found that nobody had seen or heard of Gallagher since Thursday night. Early Monday morning some fishermen found his body floating in the water.

The deceased was born on Beaver Island about thirty-eight years ago, and for the past fifteen years has followed the lakes, holding numerous responsible positions on different boats, and at the time of his death held first-class pilot's papers for all the lakes.

In June 1910 he was married to Miss Mamie Gallagher, daughter of Capt. John C. Gallagher, and one of the island's most popular young ladies. Two children were the result of this union. The youngest being less than a year old.

Besides his widow and two children he is survived by four sisters and two brothers; one of the brothers, Owen, first officer on the steamer Racine, who accompanied the remains to the Island, received a message the next day after his arrival announcing the death of his oldest son at Milwaukee. He left at once on the first boat for the above city.

The self-sacrificing nature that characterized our deceased friend is shown by the following incident: 'A few years ago while acting as mate on one of the lake boats, the boat ran aground on the captain's watch, knowing that a real hardship would befall the captain and his family if he was compelled to give up his position, he shouldered all the blame, resigned his position as mate and left the boat'.
