This packet of information is designed to help make your transition to our school a smooth one. If you are receiving this packet, it means that you have already completed the initial registration process in the district office. Don't forget to bring all of your health forms to the school nurse as well! This must be done before you can schedule a meeting with your school counselor.

Next Steps:

Once you have completed the registration process, and brought all health forms to the school nurse, you will need to schedule an appointment with your school counselor. You may do so by contacting the School Counseling Department Office Assistant at (914) 269-5432.

At this initial meeting, you will work together with your counselor to register for the appropriate classes, discuss NYS graduation requirements, and answer any individual questions you may have.

Preparing for your first school counseling meeting:

Your meeting will typically last around 30 minutes. Either before or after the meeting, your counselor will connect you with a current student who will give you a school tour. At this time (or another pre-scheduled time), you may also be asked to complete some placement exams.

	All report cards from the current school year.

TECHNOLOGY @ IRVINGTON HIGH SCHOOL

HOME ACCESS CENTER (http://tinyurl.com/irvingtonhomeaccess):

Home Access Center is a live portal Irvington High School uses to record attendance and graded assignments. It is also where families can access report cards and unofficial transcript information. Families register for an account when they enroll in the district.

GOOGLE G-SUITE:

Irvington High School assigns every student a google account where they can access their google drive. Classroom teachers use the google drive to share work with students. Counselors use google drive to schedule appointments with students. This account is typically firstname.lastname@irvingtonschools.org

GOOGLE CLASSROOM:

Starting in fall of 2017, all teachers will be using Google Classroom exclusively for posting information and accepting assignments for their classes. At the beginning of the year, a registration code is provided to link students to their class. Students who arrive later in the year should ask their teachers for the registration code so they can link their Irvington account with Google Classroom. Families can sign up for weekly bulletins of information. At this time, they are not granted access to the google classroom page.

NAVIANCE (https://student.naviance.com/irvington) & SCOIR (www.scoir.com):

Naviance and SCOIR are both programs designed to increase communication, organization, and accountability within the IHS community. Students can research colleges and careers, indicate college interest, register for events, and eventually will create a final list of colleges through this program. IHS can use this program to track student progress through the application process, send school documents online (including your recommendations), and obtain admissions statistics specific to our school. If you don't have access to either platform, please reach out to the Counseling Office.

CASTLE LEARNING:

This website is designed to supplement classroom learning. Through this program, teachers can design homework, projects, and review for students to do both in and outside the classroom. Formal feedback is given through the program. Teachers using Castle Learning will set up a portal in their individual classes.

LOGGING IN AND CONNECTING:

Logging into the District Network:

Username: firstname.lastname (i.e. John.Doe)

Initial Password: Passwords will be set to irvington (all lower case)

If it is your first time logging into your school account you will be prompted to change your password. Your new password needs to be at least 8 characters long and include 1 capital letter and 1 number. Your network password is linked to your district Google account. When your network password is changed it will automatically sync your new password with your Google account. To change your password at any point in the future, after you log-in, hit Ctrl+Alt+Del and select 'Change a Password.'

Logging into your Google Account and Gmail:

Username: first.last@irvingtonschools.org (i.e. John.Doe@irvingtonschools.org)

Initial Password: Same as your District Network password

Prior to using your Google account, you should be sure to follow the steps above to change the password to your district network account. Once your password for the network has changed, it will automatically sync with your Google account. Then you can go to Google.com to login to your Google account. Once you are logged in to your Google account you will be able to access Gmail, Google Docs, Google Classroom, etc. Access codes for specific Google Classroom classes will be distributed by teachers.

REGENTS DIPLOMA WITH HONORS:

- Achievement of basic requirements (please refer to Graduation Requirement chart) plus -
- Attainment of 5 Regents exams with a computed average score of 90 or better as follows: 1 Math, 1 Science, ELA, Global History, US History & Government.

REGENTS DIPLOMA WITH ADVANCED DESIGNATION:

- Achievement of requirements for Regents Diploma (please refer to Graduation Requirement chart) plus -
- Scores 65 or better on each of 8 Regents Examinations and LOTE Local Exam

REGENTS DIPLOMA WITH ADVANCED DESIGNATION with annotation that denotes Mastery in Math:

- Achievement of requirements for Regents with Advanced Designation (please refer to Graduation Requirement chart) plus –
- Scores 85 or better on each of 3 Regents Examinations in Mathematics

REGENTS DIPLOMA WITH ADVANCED DESIGNATION with annotation that denotes Mastery in Science:

- Achievement of requirements for Regents with Advanced Designation (please refer to Graduation Requirement chart) plus –

REGENTS DIPLOMA THROUGH MULTIPLE PATHWAYS 4+1 ALTERNATIVE

Required four (4): ELA Regents exam, 1 math Regents exam, 1 science Regents exam, 1 social studies, -plus- any one (1) of the following assessments:

- Achievement of basic credit requirements (please refer to Graduation Requirement chart) plus-
- Additional math Regents exam; or science Regents exam; or social studies Regents exam; or the local Language other than English (LOTE) exam; or a department approved CTE pathway assessment, following successful completion of an approved CTE program
