Angus Bethune, a football player with divorced parents, is worried about the Winter Ball because he is nominated for Winter King, something he assumes is a joke, and his crush, Melissa, will be there. Melissa arrives with another date, who proves to be problematic, and she confides in Angus about her struggles with bulimia before asking him to escort her from the dance in spite of her date's threats of violence. This short story is an example of Crutcher's use of humor and self-deprecating language to reveal the humanity of his characters. Crutcher's background as a therapist is on display through the honest portrayal of his characters' inner struggles.

Style discussion highlights Crutcher's use of a fairy tale structure and allusions to convey a message about the human potential for transformation.
