Medical Exemptions

Oregon allows medical exemptions for children who have a medical condition that contraindicates vaccination. Only physicians or local health departments may sign a medical exemption. Children with this type of medical exemption are considered susceptible because if they are exposed to a disease that they haven't been vaccinated for, they are likely to get it.

Medical exemptions must be in a letter from a physician or local health department supplementing the Certificate of Immunization Status.

The letter must include:

- 1. Child's name
- 2. Child's birth date
- 3. The Vaccine(s) affected
- 4. The condition that contraindicates vaccination
- 5. The physician's or local health department representative's signature
- 6. The physician's or local health department representative's contact information.

*In case of an outbreak of vaccine-preventable disease in a community, the local health department has the legal authority to exclude from school or childcare attendance any child who has not been completely immunized, including children with a medical exemption.
