About Girls Going Global

Girls Going Global (GGG) is a nonprofit organization committed to empowering girls from underrepresented communities through global leadership programming. Since 2012, we have equipped over 500 girls with the tools to become culturally competent leaders through travel, education, and civic engagement.

About the Fill-A-Plane: Ghana 100 Travel Camp

In July 2026, Girls Going Global will lead its most ambitious initiative to date: **Ghana 100**, an international travel camp for 100 Black high school girls to engage in career development, cultural exchange, and global service.

Over the course of nine months—including a 10-day immersive experience in Ghana—participants will explore career tracks such as:

- Public Affairs
- STEM & Technology
- Creative Arts & Media
- Healthcare & Wellness
- Business & Entrepreneurship

Each student will also contribute to meaningful community service efforts while building sisterhood and leadership skills that last a lifetime.

Role of a Chaperone

GGG chaperones are more than trip supervisors—they are mentors, leaders, and community builders. Our chaperone team includes professionals, graduate students, and global citizens who are passionate about youth development, cultural exchange, and service learning. Chaperones will not be responsible for all 100 girls; instead, participants will be divided into smaller groups of approximately 20–25 girls, each supported by a minimum of 2-3 additional chaperones ensuring that every chaperone works closely with a manageable group alongside a strong support team.



Chaperones are expected to:

- Serve as positive role models and mentors to high school aged girls ages 13–17
- Support development within specific career tracks
- Participate fully in service activities, workshops, and cultural excursions
- Foster a safe, respectful, and inspiring group dynamic

We are seeking chaperones who are:

◆ Mentors

- Committed to youth development and equity
- Willing to share professional experiences and personal insights
- Open-minded, respectful, and values-driven

◆ Leaders

- Confident communicators and problem-solvers
- Able to adapt, motivate, and take initiative
- Comfortable balancing structure with flexibility

◆ Global Citizens

- Previous international travel experience preferred
- Passionate about cultural awareness and global service
- Ready to walk, hike, and explore Ghana's vibrant terrain

Eligibility & Commitment

Junior Chaperones	18+ (recent graduates, college students)
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Adult Chaperones	25–60 years old
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Time Commitment

- Attend **5 virtual meetings** (Dec 2025–June 2026)
- Participate in **Pre-Departure Orientation (June 2026)**



- Travel to Ghana: **10 days in July 2026**
- Available to fly roundtrip with the group from Atlanta or Philadelphia airports

Financial Commitment

Note: This cost is subsidized through corporate and community support. Actual program value is \$6,500. Chaperone contributions help offset costs and ensure the experience remains affordable and accessible for the girls we serve.

- **Total Cost:** \$5,000
- Includes flights, lodging, all meals, and activities
- **\$500 Non-Refundable Commitment Fee due October 24, 2025**
- Remaining balance of **\$4,500** payable in installments (payment plans and fundraising tools available)

Key Responsibilities

- Supervise and support youth throughout the travel camp
- Attend all required meetings and training sessions
- Live in group housing with students and co-chaperones
- Participate in daily excursions, community service, and debriefs
- Uphold safety policies (no alcohol while supervising or traveling with students)
- Collaborate with team to lead a planning area (2–4 hours/month)

Required Qualifications

- Strong experience working with teens
- Professional background aligned with one of the camp's career tracks
- Excellent organizational and communication skills
- Demonstrated cultural competence and integrity
- Enthusiasm, patience, and a deep commitment to girls' empowerment
