It's important to clearly identify the corresponding author, who will manage all stages of the pre-publication and post-publication process. The list should include the full names of all authors and co-authors. The corresponding author is responsible for handling all communications throughout the review, publication, and post-publication stages.

TITLE (Arial Narrow 14)

The paper's title should be clear, concise, and informative, avoiding the use of abbreviations and formulas whenever possible. It should accurately and briefly describe the content of the research.

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ABSTRACT (Arial 10) in english

The abstract is placed after the title page in the manuscript. It should be a self-contained summary that includes the introduction and purpose, methods, results, conclusion, and suggestions, all within a single paragraph without using section headings. References should not be included, and non-standard or uncommon abbreviations should be avoided; if they are necessary, they must be defined when first mentioned. The abstract should be between 150 and 200 words and include keywords, but no references.

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KEYWORDS (Arial 10)

Keywords should be specific and avoid general or plural terms, as well as multiple concepts. Do not repeat words or phrases already used in the title as keywords. These keywords will be used for indexing, and there should be no more than five keywords or phrases, listed in alphabetical order.

INTRODUCTION (Arial 10)

Clearly state the objectives of your work and provide sufficient background information, but avoid giving a detailed literature review or summarizing the results. Explain how you approached the problem and clearly outline the goals of your study. When writing the introduction, consider readers who may not be experts in the field. The introduction should be between 750 and 1000 words.

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MATERIALS AND METHODS (Arial 10)

The time and location of the research should be mentioned at the beginning. Clearly and concisely describe all materials and methods used, including any chemicals for analysis, treatments, and experimental design. The objectives of the work should be stated, providing enough background without delving into a detailed literature review or summarizing results. The Theory section should build upon the background provided in the Introduction, laying the groundwork for further study, while the Calculation section should translate theory into practical application. The Materials and Methods section should be written in 400 to 600 words.

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RESULTS AND DISCUSSION (Arial 10)

The Results and Discussion should be combined into a single section. Present the results in a logical sequence, starting with the main findings and followed by supporting results, along with a corresponding discussion. Use units of measurement that adhere to the international system. This section should be written in 2500 to 3000 words.

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTION (Arial 10)

The conclusion should be clearly stated. After the conclusion, the suggestion section should provide recommendations based on the research or offer practical advice that can be directly used by consumers. Both the conclusion and suggestions should be written within 40 to 80 words.

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REFERENCES (Arial 10)

Authors should use a reference management tool like Mendeley. All references cited must be listed in the reference section, following the American Psychological Association (APA) style, and arranged alphabetically. The references should predominantly be from the last 10 years, with at least 80% from journals. Most references should be primary sources, especially those from the last five years. Unpublished data and personal communications should not be included as citations. However, "In Press" articles that have been accepted for publication can be cited, including the journal name and the expected publication date if available. The reference list should include at least 16 sources.¹
