### **FELLOWSHIP OVERVIEW**

The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education and the Rennie Center welcome history/social science teachers to apply to become Civics Curriculum Teacher Advisors. Advisors meet to review evidence of curricular materials' alignment to Massachusetts standards for Grade 8, cultural responsiveness, and usability. This is a great opportunity to make a positive impact across the Commonwealth while connecting with peers from other districts and deepening knowledge about quality curriculum.

Teacher advisors receive a \$1000 stipend for the successful completion of the Advisory Panel.

### **REQUIREMENTS**

All teacher advisors must possess the following characteristics:

1. Current teacher of record in a Massachusetts public school
2. At least three years' teaching experience
3. Deep content knowledge/understanding of the Massachusetts Curriculum Framework for grade 8 history/social science
4. Ability to attend all panel meetings
