- **Education Spirit Week (cont'd)** Education Spirit Week (cont'd) will be celebrated the month of December to celebrate Walt Disney's Birthday (December 5, 1901) (Fun Facts about Walt Disney) What Is Your Favorite Disney Book Or Character? Why?)
 1. During World War II, Walt Disney created cartoons for the U.S government to help boost morale.
 2. Walt Disney was a railroad enthusiast who built model train sets to relax after work. His uncle was a steam locomotive engineer, and Disney sold snacks and newspapers on trains as a teenager.
 3. In 1932, Disney produced Flowers and Trees, the first full-color Technicolor cartoon. Disney had exclusive rights to use the new process until the end of 1935.
 4. Walt Disney's first animation studio was Laugh-O-Gram, where he told modernized fairy tales based on Aesop's Fables.
 5. Walt Disney was the original voice of Mickey Mouse, but he didn't draw him.
 6. To sell the idea for Snow White And The Seven Dwarfs, Walt Disney performed it as a one-man show.
 7. Walt Disney holds the record for the most Academy Awards won by an individual, with 22 wins and 59 nominations between 1932 and 1969.
 8. Walt Disney got the idea for Disneyland while watching his daughters ride a merry-go-round at Griffith Park. He was inspired to create a place where families could make magical memories.



9. Walt Disney held the patent for Technicolor for 2 years, making him the only animator who could make color animated films at the time.
 10. Walt Disney started his career in 1919 at the Kansas City Slide Company, where he worked on stop-action animation commercials. He later left with animator, Ub Iwerks, to start their own company, Laugh-O-Grams.
 11. Walt Disney was married to Lillian Bounds, a Disney ink artist, and they had 2 daughters, Diane and Sharon.
 12. Rumors circulated after Walt Disney's death that he was cryogenically frozen, but he was actually cremated and buried in a mausoleum.
 13. Walt Disney built a half-mile railroad around his property in Holmby Hills, Los Angeles, and would dress up as a train engineer to give visitors rides.

 - **R.L Stine "Goosebumps"**
 - Stine said that he was inspired by reading the Tales From The Crypt comic books when he was young. He also said he remembered what it felt like to be frightened and panicked as a child, which he brought into his work on the Goosebumps series.
 - Stine has sold over 400 million books and his books have been translated into 35 languages
 - Stine's first professional writing job was contributing stories to humor magazines. He published his first book for children, The Absurdly Silly Encyclopedia & Fly Swatter, in 1978 under the pseudonym Jovial Bob Stine. His first scary novel, Blind Date, was released in 1986.
 - Stine's personal favorite Goosebumps book is *The Haunted Mask*.
 - Stine was originally contracted for just 4 Goosebump books.
 - Christmas**
 - **Charles M. Schultz "Charlie Brown Christmas"**
 - Most of the voice actors were cast from kids in the director's neighborhood
 - Schultz didn't like the name Peanuts because he thought it made the comic sound insignificant
 - CBS and Coca-Cola only gave them \$76,000 to produce it
 - CBS hated *A Charlie Brown Christmas*
 - Charlie Brown's head was a nightmare to animate
 - Snoopy's voice is just sped-up nonsense
 - **Tim Burton "Nightmare Before Christmas"**
 - Tim Burton wasn't the director. Henry Selick directed the film, but Burton was the producer.
