

THE CANONS OF A NAUTILUS

EQUITY, CAMARADERIE, HONOUR

XVOCABULARY SPECIFICATIONS:

- 'A NAUTICCAN' A person within the community of the Democracy of Nauticca, unrelated to their status of command.
- 'A CITIZEN OF NAUTICCA' A Nauticcan with specifically no status of command.
- 'A COMMANDER' A Citizen of Nauticca individually appointed through methods of election to lead the Democracy of Nauticca.

XUNIT I: THE COMMAND OF THE DEMOCRACY OF NAUTICCA

- CODE ONE: The Democracy of Nauticca is led by The Coterie.
 - 1. The Coterie consists of a maximum of three Commanders.
 - 2. A Commander is a Citizen of Nauticca individually appointed through methods of election.
 - These elections must last forty-eight hours unless 100% of the community participates prior to the forty-eight hour mark.
 - A candidate must inform a current Commander of their intention to stand for election.
 - A Nauticcan has the right to begin a vote to elect a Commander [UNIT I & UNIT II, CODE III, 5].
 - A Citizen of Nauticca has the right to become a Commander of Nauticca [UNIT II, CODE III, 10].
 - 3. A Commander is to be dismissed from the position through methods of expulsion.
 - These expulsions must last forty-eight hours unless 100% of the community participates prior to the forty-eight hour mark.
 - Should an expulsion vote fail, the Commander in question will remain in their position and retain all rights and duties of a Commander.
 - A Nauticcan has the right to begin a vote to expel a Commander [UNIT I& UNIT II, CODE III, 4].



- A Commander has the right to temporarily remove the rights and responsibilities of a Commander who is the subject of an expulsion [UNIT I, CODE III, 10].
- A Commander has the right to abdicate their status of command [UNIT I, CODE III, 13].
- CODE TWO: A Commander of the Democracy of Nauticca has the following duties:
 - 1. To uphold the Canons of a Nautilus.
 - 2. To protect Nauticca.
 - 3. To represent the Citizens of Nauticca in external matters.
 - 4. To initiate and relinquish the status of being a Nauticcan upon those who desire it.
 - 5. To enforce the Canons of a Nautilus within Nauticca.
- CODE THREE: A Commander of the Democracy of Nauticca has the following rights:
 - 1. To exploit, own and administer private property.
 - 2. To life.
 - 3. To protest.
 - 4. To begin an expulsion to dismiss a Commander.
 - 5. To begin an election to appoint a Commander.
 - Solely when The Coterie is not full.
 - 6. To vote within an election.
 - Solely when they are not the subject of the election.
 - 7. To voice and express opinions and beliefs.
 - 8. To a fair trial.
 - 9. To equity.
 - 10. To remove the rights and responsibilities of a Commander who is the subject of an expulsion vote.
 - Should an expulsion vote fail, the subject Commander will stay in office
 - 11. To declare peace from battle.
 - 12. To declare war.
 - Solely with the majority of The Coterie's approval.
 - 13. To abdicate their status of command.
- CODE FOUR: The Coterie has the ability to amend the Canons of a Nautilus.
 - 1. This is solely with all the entirety of The Coterie's approval.
- CODE FIVE: The Coterie has the ability to carry out any official act.



1. This is solely if there is no law, decree, or other official statute which outlaws the official act.

XUNIT II: THE PEOPLE OF THE DEMOCRACY OF NAUTICCA

- CODE ONE: A Citizen of Nauticca is a Nauticcan with no status of command.
- CODE TWO: A Citizen of Nauticca has the following duties:
 - 1. To uphold the Canons of a Nautilus.
 - 2. To protect Nauticca.
 - 3. To obey orders from the Coterie.
- CODE THREE: A Citizen of Nauticca has the following rights:
 - 1. To exploit, own and administer private property.
 - 2. To life.
 - 3. To protest.
 - 4. To begin an expulsion to dismiss a Commander.
 - 5. To begin an election to appoint a Commander.
 - Solely when the Coterie is not full.
 - 6. To vote within an election.
 - Solely when they are not the subject of the election.
 - 7. To voice and express opinions and beliefs.
 - 8. To a fair trial.
 - 9. To equity.
 - 10. To become a Commander of Nauticca.



XUNIT III: THE SYSTEM OF JUSTICE

- CODE ONE: The Tribunal examines violations to the Duties, Rights and Commandments contained within the Canons of a Nautilus.
- CODE TWO: The Tribunal consists of a Magistrate, a Prosecution Barrister, a Defence Barrister and Public Advocates per case.
 - 1. A Prosecution Barrister collects and presents evidence that the Defendant is guilty of the accused violation to The Tribunal.
 - 2. A Defence Barrister collects and presents evidence that the Defendant is innocent of the accused violation to The Tribunal.
 - This position is filled by the personal choice of the Defendant.
 - 3. Public Advocates are any Citizens of Nauticca who wish to participate in the case at hand.
 - This position is not necessary to The Tribunal.
 - 4. A Magistrate and the Public Advocates discuss the outcome of a case once all evidence has been presented and all questioning completed.
 - The position of Magistrate can only be filled by a Commander.
 - 5. A Magistrate will make the final decision of the punishments issued to the violator.
- CODE THREE: Punishments that may be given by The Tribunal are as follows:
 - 1. Banishment.
 - 2. Imprisonment.
 - 3. Fines.
 - 4. Revocation of certain rights.
 - It is the discretion of the Tribunal to determine which rights may be revoked.



XUNIT IV: THE COMMANDMENTS


- CODE ONE: The Commandments are laws which are not to be disobeyed by any Nauticcans.
- CODE TWO: The breaking of a Nauticcan's rights shall not be tolerated.
 - 1. [UNIT I & UNIT II, CODE III]
- CODE THREE: The breaking of your duties shall not be tolerated.
 - 1. [UNIT I & UNIT II, CODE II]
- o CODE FOUR: The breaking of oaths shall not be tolerated.
 - 1. An oath is a binding agreement in written word.
 - 2. An oath can be relinquished if all individuals involved all approve.
 - 3. The Initiation Oath and additional oaths involving the government can be relinquished with the entirety of The Coterie's approval.
 - The relinquishment of the Initiation Oath requires a ceremony involving a Commander.
- CODE FIVE: The sharing of Nauticcan information shall not be tolerated.
 - 1. Direct permission from a Commander bypasses this commandment.
 - 2. Nauticcan information is any information directed at you by other Nauticcans because of your status as Nauticcan.
- o CODE SIX: To gain the status of Nauticcan, one must participate in the Initiation Oath.
 - 1. The Initiation Oath includes a ceremony where a ceremonial cutlass is bestowed upon the Nauticcan-to-be, along with the Nauticcan-to-be oathing to their duties on paper.
 - 2. The Initiation Oath is required to be overseen by a Commander.
- one must relinquish the Initiation Oath.
 - 1. This involves a ceremony performed by a Commander taking place.
