



Out-of-State Voter Registrations Cancellations

- Email Procedure

Target Voters- i.e. College Students, Over 90 years,

Example: College Students

Issue: In Florida, voters must register using a residential address, which can include a dormitory or campus apartment.

- There is no automatic removal from the rolls when someone graduates or moves unless the voter notifies election officials or their address is otherwise updated.
- Many students register in Florida during school but remain registered in their home state.
- This creates dual registration, which is not illegal by itself—but voting in both states is a felony.

Data: Identify registrations using dormitory or off-campus apartment addresses near colleges. Filter for voters with out-of-state mailing addresses, registration dates older than five years, and those who provided email addresses. Where duplicate email addresses are associated with the same residential address, attempt to verify the correct individual tied to the registration.

Note: Every county in Florida currently has a unique voter cancellation form.
