

In the monthly newsletters, the Union will publish editorials written by members. These pieces are a great way for members to express themselves on a wide range of issues, from political opinions to school decisions, or to just talk about life in general. There is a high degree of freedom given to the writers of the editorials, with just a few restrictions limiting them. These are:

1. The article *cannot* demean another person or group, regardless of whether they are represented in the Union;
2. The article must be under 700 words;
3. Sources used must be cited, either in hyperlinked text or at the bottom of the piece;
4. All pieces must be submitted by the 25th of each month.

We ask that a rough idea or outline is shared with The Board before one starts writing, so as to avoid a finished piece getting rejected. Once the editorial is written, it should be shared with Board Members for editing -- a process done in collaboration with the author, of course.
