## OPEN LETTER FOR ONLINE TEACHING UNTIL SAFETY THRESHOLDS FOR VACCINATION AND POSITIVITY RATES ARE ACHIEVED

Fueled by the highly infectious Delta variant, daily new cases of COVID-19 in the U.S. have risen to roughly 150,000. We are now seeing the highest weekly average of COVID-19 cases since early February. On August 24, NCDHHS reported 4,623 new COVID-19 cases, 3,342 currently hospitalised COVID-19 patients, and an average daily positivity rate of 14.7%... Watauga County, along with nearly all counties in North Carolina, is currently at the highest level of community transmission per Centers for Disease Control and Prevention metrics and is now in an officially declared state of emergency. As of August 20, Watauga County's seven day test positivity rate is at 7.53%.

According to the App State COVID-19 Dashboard, as of August 23, 87% of faculty and staff are fully vaccinated, but only 49% of students are fully vaccinated. The student vaccination percentage stands in stark contrast to the 70% vaccination goal that AppHealthCare is trying to attain. This is particularly alarming given the great concern expressed by Appalachian Regional Healthcare System officials regarding the current surge in infections, staffing shortages, and the need to open additional COVID units in the system.

The crisis posed by the Delta variant also has motivated a robust <u>UNC-Chapel Hill faculty</u> <u>petition</u> to move classes online.

We commend Chancellor Everts for committing ASU to remaining "cautious and safety focused." In light of this commitment and due to the following factors: 1) the dramatic surge in COVID-19 cases nationally, statewide, and locally; 2) the low student vaccination rate at ASU; and 3) full FDA approval of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, we, the undersigned faculty of ASU, call upon Chancellor Everts and Provost Norris to move all possible courses online immediately until both of the following criteria are met:

- 1. The percentage of fully vaccinated students reaches AppHealthCare's goal of 70%
- 2. Watauga County achieves a low level of community transmission based on the CDC-recommended positivity rate of less than 5% within the county.

We must rise to meet this moment through courageous, compassionate, and moral decisions in the interest of the health and safety of our students, faculty and staff, and community.
