Ref Work Day Expectations Part 2 of 3

Business Purpose	 The FR football organization hires 20-30 new referees each year with many of the referees starting their term at different dates. With their busy schedules it is hard to get all the refs in for a formal training at the same time and the game rules often change from one year to the next. The organization's chair has been spending a lot of extra time tracking down referee information or correcting rules that could likely be alleviated if all referees were given the same explanations in an organized format before they begin working. The FR football organization wants all referees to know the rules of the game, expected work attire, what to expect when they come to work, organization expectations for checking in and out, what to do about disgruntled coaches/parents and what their pay options are.

Learning Objectives

By the end of the training, the learners will be able to...

- Apply the flag football rules on the field for refereeing fair games
- Recall ways to deescalate a situation with a disgruntled coach/parent
- Use the score sheets and sign out sheet at the end of every shift
- Identify proper work attire
- Select the payout option that best suits their needs

Training Outline for Part 2: Work Day Expectations

Scenario 1: Introduction & Laying out the step by step for work day

- Welcome
 - Refer back to part 1 of the training to tie it to part 2
 - Establish the learning outcomes of this portion of the training and why it is important to comply with the information presented on work days
- Step by step expectations and procedures:
 - Schedule, Proper attire, Check in at table where you will grab what you need, work shift, check out at the end, payment (next video)
- Scenario 1: Sound of referee whistle in the background. Introduce Game Day / Work
 Day expectations. Blank Screen with narration avatar introducing the module, Title of
 module shows on screen whistle/tilte of module fades out as a step by step visual
 slowly pops in with sound effects and animation to lay out the 4 major topics being
 covered in this microlearning

Scenario 2: Schedule

- How to get on the schedule, how to read the schedule
- Scenario 2 Setup: transition to a student checking a text message and responding with hours of availability, move over to avatar putting those hours into a schedule, student checks cell phone and sees schedule on phone, schedule pops up as whole screen using zoom features to explain how to read the schedule, take place in home or social setting with minimal background noise to match scene

Scenario 3: Attire & Checking in

- What to wear
- Middle table, grab shirt, flag, have whistle, go find your field
- Scenario 3 Setup: Transition into game day showing sports field in the background and a student wearing athletic clothing and either crocs or sandals, walk through work day attire and dress the model as work through it, there, now you are ready to work

Scenario 4: Checking Out

- Return Shirt and Flag, Keep Whistle, Score Sheet, Sign Out
- Scenario 4 Setup: referee looks tired, comes back into scene to center table after shift, puts shirt and flag away, fills out score sheet, give a demonstration with model and fills out sign out sheet, give zoom features and demonstration, end with all the things done and referee with a thought bubble of money

Scenario 5: Review / Summary

- Return Shirt and Flag, Keep Whistle, Score Sheet, Sign Out
- Scenario 5 Setup: Avatar opens it up with lets review, give a moment to reflect on what
 the work day expectations are, ask a question, give a thought bubble and pause then
 show it on the step by step visual from the beginning for review, end with road map
 fading out and introduce title of next module fading in (module title should be in the
 same format that the title for 1 & 2 are shown)
