Compositing: Death Star!

Before anything, download the Death Star:

- 1. Find/take a nice landscape/city shot.
- 2. Make any needed edits in Camera RAW.
- 3. Load your photo into Photoshop.
- 4. Go to File -> Place and select the Death Star you saved to the computer
- 5. Position the Death Star.

Select **Move** tool (top of the toolbar on the left). To **resize** it (while keeping the right proportions) hold down the **shift key** while grabbing a corner.

To **angle** it, with no keys held down, position your mouse just outside the corner until it looks like a curved line with arrows on each end. Click and drag to change the angle.

6. Now, adjust the **opacity** until it looks a little more realistic. Find opacity in the layers menu. Make sure the Death Star layer is selected.

A little more advanced:

To put the Death Star behind a building or object:

- 1. Duplicate the background layer (select it and hit Command-J).
- 2. Drag the background layer above the Death Star Layer (the D.S. will disappear, that's ok.)
- 3. Select the sky you want to hide with the **quick select** tool. (Anything you want IN FRONT of the D.S., like buildings, should NOT be selected)
- 4. Hold down **option** and click on the **Add Layer Mask** in the layer menu to hide the sky. (Also you can go to Layer -> Layer Mask -> Hide Selection)
