Abstract in English is a research summary that contains problems that are the background of the research, research objectives, research methods in general, and main conclusions. The number of words in the abstract is no more than 250 words.

Keywords: keywords in English, which are able to represent writing, a maximum of 3-5 words, arranged in alphabetical order

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Abstract in Indonesian, is a research summary that contains problems that are the background of the research, research objectives, research methods in general, and main conclusions. The number of words in the abstract is no more than 250 words.

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INTRODUCTION

The introduction briefly describes: the problem to be solved, the impact that will occur if the problem remains, the state of the art of research, and the research objectives that reflect the steps to solve the problem that has been raised. The introductory description is complemented by supporting references that are highly recommended from primary references (scientific journals).

METHOD

(Align left & bold)

Research Methods clearly and concisely describe the time and place of research, types and methods of data collection, tools and materials, data processing and analysis; which is described as a whole in the stages of research implementation. Research data that can be published is no later than 5 years from before the publication date of the manuscript.

The discussion is presented in the form of text, tables and figures that are complete and clear. The subchapters in the discussion are developed systematically and lead to conclusions.

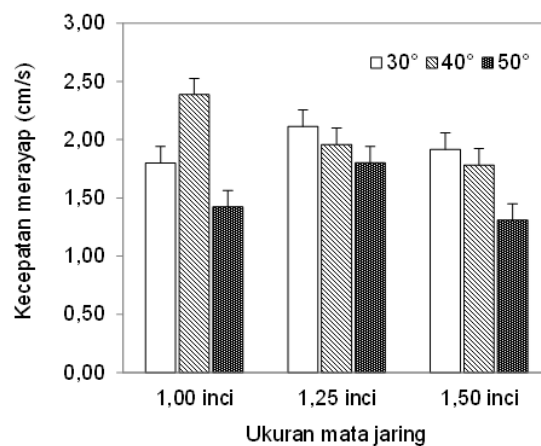

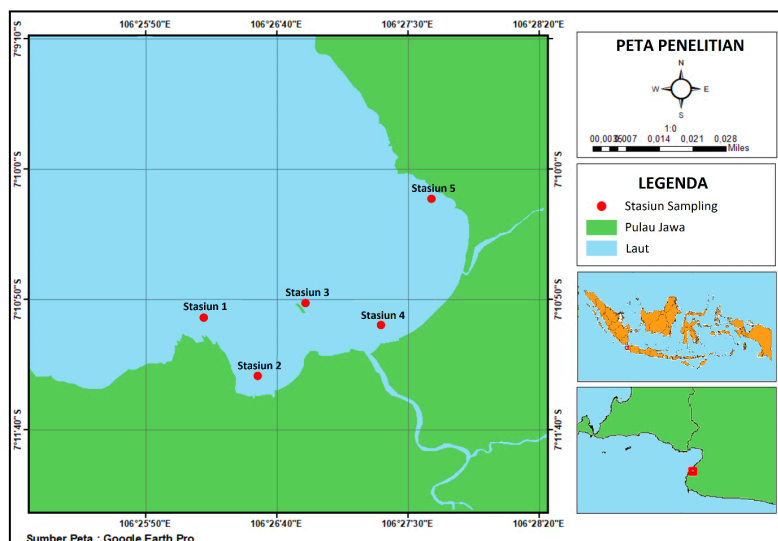


Figure 1 Map of the Research Location

Writing formulas or equations using the formula format (equation) found in MS Word. An example of writing a formula is as follows:

(Align left & bold)

Acknowledgments are intended as an appreciation to the parties involved in the research.

REFERENCES

(Align left & bold)

All References included must be cited in the manuscript, and vice versa. The References is arranged alphabetically without sequential numbers in the order: Author's name. Year published. The title of the article. Place of publication: the name of the publisher. References writing should be consistent. It is not allowed to use libraries derived from blogs and the like, the contents of which cannot be accounted for. At least 80% of library sources come from scientific journals and are the latest literature (at least the last 10 years). Please use Reference Manager Applications

like **EndNote, Mendeley, Zotero, etc.** Use other published articles in the same journal as models.

Writing a reference should follow the rules as exemplified as follows:

Journal Articles:

Author AB, Author CD, Author EF. Year. Title of article. *Name of journal*. Volume(Number): pages.
