Advanced Drawing

Course Summary:

This course is an extension of the Drawing course, where previous skills will be built upon and new skills will be learned. The majority of the drawing in this class will be done from direct observation, as this is the best way to truly perceive how objects or figures work. In this course you will deepen your study of the *elements* and *principles* of design and *composition*. At the same time, students will be encouraged to develop a personal "voice" in the work that they create. Students will be exposed to advanced drawing processes, methods, and techniques involved with the major aspects of the field including still-life, landscape, portraiture, figure, and narrative drawing. Media explored includes pen and ink, graphite, conte, charcoal, oil pastel, colored pencil, soft pastels, and watercolor. Included in the course is an exposure to art history and contemporary illustrators.

Course Objectives:

- To draw from direct observation to heighten perception skills and to understand how various objects/figures, etc "work" in reality
- To expand upon previously learned skills as they pertain to the field of drawing
- To explore a variety of media, processes, methods, and techniques within the context of drawing
- To develop an appreciation for thumbnail sketching/storyboarding as it pertains to exploring multiple "solutions" to a design "problem"
- To deeply understand composition in its many forms
- To create meaning in a piece of visual artwork through symbolism, metaphor, and narration
- To identify, analyze, and critique visual images of artists, styles, and periods
- To evaluate and analyze personal visual images as well as the work of peers
- To prepare a minimum of two (2) works for public display in a professional manner that focuses on craftsmanship
