 - Faculty discussed previous bilingual course offerings and the importance of involving faculty from these classes with the proposed best practices committee, and the importance of ensuring that there is adequate support for faculty developing bilingual classes.
 - Faculty also discussed whether the free Spanish courses offered to students would count for credit towards their degree.
 - The presenters emphasized the importance of these proposals as WOU moves towards becoming an HSI. Faculty reinforced this, noting how important it was to native bilingual Spanish-speaking students who felt validated by a recent bilingual course.

 - Faculty commented on the possibility of emphasizing study abroad in the same way as speaking Spanish, since it's so transformative to students.
