- 2 Line Managers are to note that they are responsible for production of the risk assessment and that they are signing to indicate that the risk assessment is suitable and sufficient, and they consider the risks to be acceptable.
- 3 When recording the Risk Rating ensure that both the Likelihood and Severity scores are included.
- 4 Record the residual Risk Rating to demonstrate that the risk has been reduced to an acceptable level.
- 5 Risk Assessments are to be reviewed annually and/or:
- If there is reason to doubt the effectiveness of the assessment.
- Following an accident or near miss.
- Following significant changes to the task, process, procedure or Line Management.
- Following the introduction of more vulnerable personnel.
- If "Generic" prior to use.
- 6. Each Control Measure is to be specific and managed.
- 7. Specify all persons at Risk, including Contractors, Visitors, Members of Public (P Players, S Staff including Coaches, Managers and Referees and TP Third Parties which includes visitors to fixture, vulnerable groups elderly, pregnant workers, those with underlying health conditions, supporters when clearance given to attend, and anyone else who physically comes into contact with training groups and individuals.)
