In the 50 freestyle Emma dropped 2 seconds then dropped again in the 200 freestyle relay, in her 100 freestyle she dropped almost 12 seconds then dropped another second off that time when she swam it in the 400-relay helping her team to a 3rd place finish. Teammate Clayton Schultz had a great night as well. He was able to take off 2 seconds from his 50 freestyle then another second in the relay.
