Traditionally, they are associated with collections of books, but their role is continually evolving to meet social and technological needs. Today they may deal with provision and maintenance of information in many formats, including

physical books, electronic resources, magazines, newspapers, audio and video recordings, photographs, and web-based and digital resources.

3. _____

They are professional practitioners, concerned with applying scientific knowledge, mathematics, and inventiveness to develop solutions for technical, societal and commercial problems. They design materials, structures, and systems while considering the limitations imposed by practicality, regulation, safety, and cost. Their work forms the link between scientific discoveries and their applications to human needs and quality of life.

4. _____

They must have creative skills and be interested in the environment, because they build and maintain gardens, parks and other outdoor areas. In this job they need to be able to understand design drawings and have a good knowledge of plants. They also need organizational skills to make sure projects get completed on time.

5. _____

They plan, organize and take part in leisure activities for 4 to 16 years old, so they need patience and tolerance, as well as a responsible and caring attitude. They work at places like breakfast or afterschool clubs and holiday schemes. They can be involved in activities ranging from art, crafts, cooking and drama to outdoor games and taking children on outings. Sometimes these are all on the same day. They don't need to have qualifications to start this job, but some paid or voluntary experience will be useful.

Don't Miss Animal Adventures

1. Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding, China

What's black and white and quite possibly the cuddliest thing you've ever seen? That's right. Pandas. At this breeding facility and conservation centre in Chengdu, Sichuan, visitors can watch the roly-poly bears in up close action. Need something more convincing? Come and watch!

2. Cheetah Outreach Centre, South Africa

The cheetah has its own claim to fame, this spotted cat is known for being the fastest land mammal, clocking speeds of up to 70 miles per hour. At the Cheetah Outreach Centre, outside Cape Town in Somerset West, you can spend time in a pen petting adult cats and baby cubs. But it gets better: the sanctuary also offers visitors a chance to take grown cheetahs for a “walk” along a nearby beach – and experience handler-led cub strolls on the centre’s grassy grounds.

3. Tortuga Lodge and Gardens, Costa Rica

You’ll need to take a boat or a small plane to get to this naturalist –guide-staffed property located along a riverbank in Costa Rica’s over-51,000-acre Tortuguero National Park, but it’s worth the extra travel effort. Between late June and September, you can spot Atlantic green turtles laying their eggs along the beach – and witness the hatchlings crack out of their shells starting in late August.

4. Jerez de la Frontera, Spain

Rafalca, the 22nd famous dressage horse, may have mad horse skills, but there’s an entire region in the Andalusia area of southwestern Spain dedicated to the art of equestrian dance that combines classical dressage, flamenco – and riders dressed in eighteenth-century garb. At the Royal Andalusian School of Equestrian Art, you can catch a show featuring six to eight different forms of choreography, such as Doma Vaquera, the “cowboy” form of dressage used to herd cattle in the countryside.

5. Monarch Butterfly Biosphere Reserve, Mexico

If you’re willing to wait until autumn to head south of the border, you’ll witness one of the nature’s greatest migrations. Each year, between October and March, millions of monarchs make their way en masse from eastern Canada to the Monarch Butterfly Biosphere Reserve, a natural protected area that spans 200 square miles in western central Mexico. Once they land, the butterfly cloak the forest’s tree trunks and branches, producing a gorgeous orange-and-black panorama.

6. Ancient Horses Roam Wilderness, Spain

In an oak wood spanning the border of Spain and Portugal, an ancient sight unfolds: wild horses not saddled or shod, but roaming free as they did centuries ago. Overall in existence there are only about 150 Retuertas, an ancient breed of horse, in Europe that are being recovered to try to help manage an ecosystem which has been abandoned due to the migration of humans from this part of the country.

World Famous Landscape Architects

1. Martha Schwartz

Marta is one of the icons of 20th century landscape architecture. Her impressive and controversial gardens are very different from what we are used to – sometimes they even contain neither plants nor water! Schwartz's favourite materials are plastic and stone. The characteristic features of her designs are bright colours, sharp lines and artificial structures. Her background is both in the fine arts and in the landscape architecture, and her projects range from private to urban scale.

2. Antoni Gaudi

This Catalan architect, born in Reus in 1852, can be only called by one name: a visionary. His style was absolutely unique. It included neo-Gothic elements together with Asian Oriental influences. Apart from architectural work, he was the designer of an incredible park in Barcelona – Park Guell. The Park is a masterpiece of design, full of colourful objects such as sea serpent-shaped bench or the famous salamander. It is one of the most original landscapes ever created, inspiring visitors and expressing the personality of its designer.

3. Thomas Dolliver Church

Born in 1902 in Boston, Church was one of the most important landscape architects of the 20th century. He is known for respecting the surrounding landscape, the local conditions, traditions and plants, as well as the client's wishes. His modern, simple, functional but elegant gardens complemented the house and were inspired by contemporary art. He also wrote a book carrying a

very important message for modern landscape architects – “Gardens are for People”.

4. **Gertrude Jekyll**

Gertrude Jekyll is an inspiration to female landscape architects. With her eye for colour and sensitivity to form, she created some of the most beautiful gardens in the UK, Europe and the US. Born in London on November 29th 1843, she became interested in plants and gardens as a child. She treated the garden as a canvas, painting it with plants of different colours and textures. Yet, she never failed to choose the right plants for the conditions as her knowledge of botany was also immense.

5. **Peter Josef Lenne**

Born in 1789, this Prussian landscape architect is famous for his landscape parks. He planned and established over 250 parks, mostly palace and castle gardens. He designed many parks in Potsdam, most notably park Sanssouci, park Babelsberg, the Tiergarten In Berlin and many others. His plans are characterized by spacious lawns, attractive views of the surrounding landscape and picturesque groups of trees and shrubs. Many sites of Lenne’s work are now World Heritage Sites.

6. **Frederick Law Olmsted**

This American landscape designer, popularly considered to be the father of American landscape architecture, was born in Hartford, Connecticut on April 26, 1822. Together with his senior partner, Calvert Vaux, he designed many of the famous urban parks in America, most notably Central Park and Prospect Park in New York. He believed that urban green spaces should be available equally to all citizens from every social class, which gave the foundation to the modern idea of a “public park”.

New Science. Investigation

1. A short nap after lunch may reduce your chances of suffering a heart attack. In a medical study in Greece, people who took a half-hour siesta at least three times a week were thirty-seven per cent less likely to die from heart-related illnesses. For working men, the result was even more dramatic: a sixty-four per cent reduction. The explanation could be that siestas reduce stress, one of the most common causes of heart disease.
2. There is a new treatment for skin conditions: a hot bath with hundreds of tiny toothless fish. 'Doctor fish' from Turkey eat dead and diseased cells, treating the symptoms of various illnesses of the skin. It does not hurt and the only side-effects may be some slight bleeding. Unfortunately, it is not a permanent cure. The results last only a few months.
3. A study into the effects of hugging has shown that hugs lower blood pressure, reduce the risk of heart disease, and generally improve your health. People in loving relationships benefit more from hugs. And women benefit more than men. During the study, thirty-eight American couples had to talk about a happy time, watch a romantic movie, and hug for twenty seconds.
4. Childhood obesity is a growing problem in the UK. In response to this, the British Government is to give 45,000 free pedometers to thousands of overweight children to help them become fitter. It is hoped the pedometers, which count the steps you take, will encourage the children to take more exercises and lose weight. In trials, the average number of steps taken by children rose from 8,355 to 13,939 per day.
5. A new drug that turns on a gene which burns body fat could lead to a new medicine that imitates physical exercise, allowing you to become thinner without effort. Mice on the drug lost weight even though they did not exercise and ate a high-fat diet. The aim is to create a medicine for people suffering from obesity, rather than a pill which lets you to eat too much while staying thin.
6. Millions of blind people could regain their sight thanks to a new invention being tested in the USA. A tiny camera which sits on a pair of glasses sends optical information to electrodes in the eye. This happens in real time, allowing patients to distinguish lights, shapes and movement. It could be available within two years.
