AOY's Policies and Other Helpful Information

SAFETY:

We strive to offer a family-friendly atmosphere, and what comes with families? Kids! As you drive around the campground or back out of parking spaces, please watch for children! *The speed limit on campus is 5 MPH at all times.* Honk your horn to warn those behind and around you to prevent an accident. We also recognize that our world is not as safe as it used to be. There will be people here you don't know well. We want to protect our children, and we do not want even the appearance of evil to tarnish our celebration of Yahweh's holy days. *DO NOT invite children into your tent or camper & those 18+ cannot have nonfamily members in their tents/RVs. Additionally, unmarried singles of ANY AGE should NOT be in tents or campers of the opposite gender.*

SERVICES and KITCHEN USE:

Services start at 11:00 am each morning and 3:00 pm on the High Days, 10/8 & 10/15. Check your schedule and listen to announcements to stay informed of potential changes. Children 10 and under must sit with an adult. We have two nurseries, one in the Sanctuary building and one in the Dining Hall. Ushers will be happy to direct you to any of these areas. While we recognize there are various forms of praise & worship, we ask that there be no dancing during services. You are welcome to dance at your campsite or other areas, just not in the services. The Dining Hall, Kitchen, Gym, & Activity Center are closed during services. The kitchen is closed daily from 9:00 pm through the end of services the following day. Please plan on preparing continental-style cold breakfast meals. Microwaves, toasters, and coffee will be available each morning. We also request that there be no running inside any of the buildings.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

We have a wonderful campground for you to use for a minimal daily fee. Our campus is divided into four different zones. Each zone has Neighborhood Hosts (Camp and Cleaning) to help you with any problems that may arise throughout the week. If you're having an issue with your campsite, please contact your Camp Host for assistance. Your host's contact info will be shared via email shortly before the feast begins.

- We have three main ice machines in the Bathhouse, Dining Hall, and Activity Center Lobby. A laundry room is located on the east side of the main bathhouse.

- All tent/RV campsites have 30/50 amp hookups and 120V outlets. All tent sites have 120V and water.

CAMPFIRES

Please follow the guidelines for campfires:

1. Do not leave unattended (unattended fires will be extinguished)
2. Have water in a bucket or a hose readily available to extinguish a fire
3. Do not throw gasoline or other accelerants such as starter fluid onto open fires
4. Use a fire ring or above-ground fires (create a perimeter)
5. Extinguish each night

CORPORATE LIVING

PET POLICY:

We have a NO PETS policy. The only exception is service dogs for the blind. If you need pet accommodations, you will need to make your own arrangements elsewhere prior to your arrival.

MEALS:

Everyone is responsible for their own meals. On High Days and the weekly Sabbath (10/8, 10/11, & 10/15), everyone can bring food to contribute for the COMMUNAL meal. The outdoor grilling areas are free for use anytime, but please clean up afterward. The kitchen is open from after the end of services until 9:00 pm. We observe the clean food laws specified in Scripture (Leviticus Chapter 11), and we ask you to do the same while on campus.

CLEAN UP:

We love our assembly, so please help us take care of it. Please clean up after yourself and your children as you use the facilities. There are trash bins placed around the campus and large dumpsters at the campground entrance and the back corner of the campus. *We ask that everyone participate in cleanup at as many hands make light work.* Depending on the campsite you choose, you will help clean a specific area of the campus. Upon arrival, see your feast program to locate the areas you're responsible for cleaning and your zone's Cleaning Host contact information. You will be assigned to a cleaning crew and expected to assist in cleanup.

DRESS CODE:

- Modesty will prevail in all clothing matters.

- Shirts should be long enough to prevent exposing the midriff.
- Necklines should be modest, showing no cleavage (including no see-through lace worn over exposed cleavage).
- Dresses and skirts should approach the knee (even with leggings on) for ages 10 and over.
- Shorts should approach the knee for ages 10 and over, both male and female - 9-inch inseam is recommended for both genders.
- Shorts are prohibited during formal worship services for ages 10 and over.

Prohibited Clothing:

- Sleeveless shirts, blouses, and dresses (including cold shoulder)
- Strapless, spaghetti straps, and backless garments
- Clothing that reveals bra straps or other undergarments
- Tank tops and muscle shirts
- Clothing advertising cigarettes or beer
- Clothing bearing inappropriate slogans or graphics
- Leggings, spandex, yoga pants, biker shorts, and compression shorts, unless worn *under* other garments of appropriate length as described above.

Note: *The dress code is campus-wide at all times, not limited to services, including during setup or teardown of campsites.*

Drugs, Smoking, Alcohol, etc.

AOY is a smoke-free campus / facility. Illegal drugs & substances of any kind are strictly prohibited. Although alcoholic beverage is acceptable in Yahweh's sight, drunkenness is not. *Any alcohol must be consumed at one's personal campsite and only by those 21 years or older.* Alcohol is prohibited in public areas, including community campfires, the dining hall, pavilion, gyms, etc.

CURFEW

All buildings/facilities must be cleared by 2:00 AM and all attendees must return to their campsites.

I, along with those who will be attending with me, have read and agree to abide by the rules and policies of the Assembly of Yahweh. (NOTE: non-married opposite-sex individuals are not permitted to share campsites, tents, RVs, etc., and those 18+ are not allowed to have underaged nonfamily members in their tents/RVs.)

Additionally, Lost & Found items, including items left on premises will be held for a maximum of two weeks after the event. AOY is not responsible for lost or stolen items

or for items left behind after you leave the premises. We also ask that those in attendance make it a priority to attend worship services and other feast-wide activities to assist in building community.

SPECIAL MUSIC

If it's on your heart, we would love for you to share a special song offering with the congregation. If you would like to do so, please coordinate with Aiden Hunt as soon as possible to allow adequate setup, planning, scheduling, etc. Music and lyrics must align with AOY doctrine. This year, you will be able to purchase shirts and any other available merchandise through this website: <https://thechurch.shop/shop/aoy/>. It is a third-party vendor, and payments, shipments, returns, etc., need to be dealt with directly with The Church Shop.

If you requested a campsite, a link will be emailed to you the following business day in the order registrations are received. NOTE: We strongly recommend using a computer rather than a phone to complete a campsite reservation. Rates: \$15.00 a night for an RV spot and \$10.00 per night for a tent spot to cover the cost of water, electricity, etc. Use the link to choose and reserve your campsite. The site includes a map for selecting available spots. *We'll do our best to honor requests, but specific site locations are not guaranteed. All reservations are subject to review and possible adjustment by AOY. Due to the number of attendees, we can't guarantee that groups will be placed near each other.* You may arrive as early as Sunday, October 5th and must vacate by Sunday, October 19th. Usage of facilities will be limited before October 8th and after October 15th. After selecting your site, you'll see the total amount due. Payment must be completed online by credit or debit card to finalize your reservation.

Unless one is elderly or physically unable to perform certain tasks, we expect everyone to pitch in with cleanup. ***You are assigned one area to help clean up based on your camping location (see below).*** If you are not camping, we kindly ask that you help out when on site. Below are the areas where one can serve:

- ☐ Red Area - Gym (main area & restrooms)
- ☐ Purple Area - Activity Center (main area, restrooms, lounge areas)
- ☐ Yello Area RVs - Bathhouse (men and women) & Laundry Room
- ☐ Yellow Area TENTS - Outdoor areas, pavilion, patios, playground, etc.
- ☐ Green Area - Dining Hall and Kitchen
- ☐ Blue Area - Main Sanctuary Building
- ☐ I am a first responder, nurse, doctor, paramedic, and can be available for emergencies
- ☐ Unable to serve

WEAPONS

DELIVERY of RVs

If you are having an RV delivered, you must make arrangements with the company and provide them all the necessary information to set up your RV. AOY personnel will not be available nor is responsible for RV deliveries and set up. A map will be at the entrance of the property. There are 4 entrances to the property:

- a. 1 on Highway 183 (labeled as south entrance)
- b. 3 on County Road 280

It is best to enter off of Highway 183 or the 3rd entrance on County Road 280 (between sites 62 and 64).

Mail, Internet, Amazon, Stores, etc.

Our staff goes through extensive preparations to make this Feast enjoyable for all and honorable to our Father. We want them to also enjoy the week-long celebration with minimal disruptions and unnecessary requests. Please refrain from having packages and mail delivered to AOY during FOT. There are stores within 12 to 20 minutes from the assembly where you can purchase needed items (Brookshires, Dollar General, WalMart, etc.). While we have limited guest wifi - it will be strained due to the number of guests. If you are dependent on wifi for the week due to work obligations, you may want to consider a hotspot. Verizon customers typically have a difficult time with a signal in this area.
