

## **Year 7 Music | Keyboard Skills Part 2**

## Key Question: How can I play the keyboard like a professional?

**Topic Overview:** This term students will learn to play classical and popular music on the keyboard. They will learn about accidentals and develop their ability to play using both hands, developing their coordination and finger technique and will begin to understand traditional notation.
