Impact of Work:

As the Student Engagement Coordinator for the BSW program, I promote student engagement through leadership and academic opportunities. I work with the director of the program, Dr. Mary Nienow. Among many other responsibilities, one part of the director's job is to help students feel connected and supported during the course of their program.

I have many tasks I complete while in this role, many of which I was able to create, so I always have something to do, and it gives me a strong sense of ownership. Some of the larger outreach responsibilities I'm in charge of include the weekly Social Work Digest newsletters, co-advising the Student Leadership Team & Social Work Club, and communicating with prospective and current social work students.
