Kia ora Parents, Caregivers and Students,

We've had a wonderful first week back, it was great to see so many of our students are staff channeling their inner Jedi or Sith on Star Wars Day!

We have a busy week this week with our Book Fair in Ōterotu, we hope to see lots of you there! This week also sees The Whitmarsh Academy start after-school football every Tuesday. Today we have 33 students away from school. Breaking down this figure, we have 7 students who are positive for Covid, 4 students who are isolating and the remaining 22 students either staying home from being unwell or absent for other regular reasons. Last week we had 13 students testing positive for Covid.

Thanks again to all our staff, students and families for their positive attitudes with regards to Covid, and fingers crossed this trend of decreasing covid cases continues. A reminder that masks are strongly recommended, this is following Ministry of Education and Health and Government guidelines,

#### Adverse Weather:

It's almost that time of the year when we can get snowfall to the Basin floor. In the event of adverse weather conditions overnight, the bus and school organisation may adapt. If changes are made they are likely to be:

- School has a **delayed start** (often 10am), buses may be delayed or cancelled
- School is **closed**. We liaise with roading contractors, police, QLDC & all the schools in the Wakatipu Basin, and our decisions are generally coordinated (although sometimes conditions are different for schools).

If there is a change to 'School as Normal' it will be communicated in a number of ways: Please note; **No messages No change** 

- On the front page of the school website will share any changes
- Facebook posts will be made
- On School Loop Notice will be made
- Phone Voice message will be updated

All local radio stations More FM - preferred, Plus as required Classic Hits, will broadcast any changes to the structure of the school day / start times and bus timetable changes <u>around 7.15am</u>.

If it snows during the day, school will stay open. School buses will not run early. If it is judged unsafe for buses to run at the end of the day, children will be kept at school until they are picked up by their parents. Wait until it is safe to drive before you come to pick up your children; there is no need for you to drive in hazardous conditions.

Your children will be well looked after at school. It may even be that some children need to stay here after school or even overnight in extreme conditions.

At Orange, face masks are no longer mandatory at school. However public health advice is that masks continue to be strongly encouraged when indoors and we strongly encourage students to continue wearing masks when indoors. Wearing a mask is a key health measure that slows the spread of COVID-19 in indoor settings. For that reason, we ask that visitors to the school, including parents and whānau, who will be entering indoor areas sign in at the office and continue to wear a mask at all times indoors. We strongly encourage masks to be worn when outside on the school grounds.

We also ask that your child (if they are Year 4+) continues to bring a mask to school every day. There may be times that we'll ask them to wear a mask too – for example, when we are having an assembly in the hall. If there are a high number of cases at school or in the community, we may ask that masks be worn in classrooms for a time.

At Orange, students aged 12 and above are still required to wear a face mask on school or public transport.
