There are several ways to reduce your financial burden as homeowners who require a stairlift. While it may be difficult to acquire a stairlift completely free of cost, there are several government grants and financial aids that can reduce the final cost of the stairlift. Here are some ways you can partially finance your stairlift:

Disabled Facilities Grant (DFG)

This is a government-funded scheme aimed to help people with disabilities in making necessary adaptations to their homes. DFG provides up to £30,000 in England, £36,000 in Wales, and £25,000 in Northern Ireland to cover home adaptations (including stairlifts). Your application will be processed by the local council and will be based on need, financial situation, and feasibility of the modifications.

To apply for a DFG, contact your local council's housing or environmental health department. This grant is means-tested (except for children under 19) and requires justification of need, financial details, and quotes from contractors. Processing times can take up to six months.

Grants from charities

There are several charities such as Turn2Us, Independence at Home, and The ACT Foundation in the UK that help you with buying and installing stairlifts. These are usually for low-income households, elderly individuals or those with severe mobility issues.

Access to Work scheme

The Access to Work Scheme in the UK gives financial support to individuals with disabilities or health conditions to help them overcome barriers in the workplace. Its primary focus is on workplace adjustments, but it can also cover costs for home adaptations like stairlifts if they are essential for accessing work-related activities in your house. You can contact Access to Work through GOV.UK or relevant organisations. You will be assessed based on your job requirements and mobility challenges.

Assistance through the local council

Your local council may offer you smaller home adaptation grants or low-cost loans which can help in reducing the overall cost of the stairlift. These grants cost less than £1,000 and while most stairlifts cost more than that, these grants can contribute towards the final cost of the stairlift.

Payment plans and low-interest loans

Many stairlift providers in the UK offer flexible payment plans that allow you to spread the cost over time. These usually allow you to set a repayment time of 6 to 36 months and monthly payments can cost you as low as £50 - £100 (depending on the total cost and repayment period). Some providers offer 0% Annual Percentage Rate (APR) for a limited period, while others may apply low-interest rates.

Other support options

Personal Independence Payment (PIP) and Attendance Allowance are UK government benefits designed to help individuals with disabilities or health conditions in managing the additional costs associated with their needs. This includes home adaptations such as stairlifts. Additionally, military veterans with mobility issues may qualify for financial aid through Royal British Legion or SSAFA.
