- The Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies major consists of **9 courses** (36 credit hours) of coursework. Students in the major are required to complete the following program of study.
- Each course can only be selected to fulfill one requirement and cannot be double counted in more than one required category.
- Simmons requires that all undergraduates complete a minimum of 128 credits of coursework, fulfill PLAN and major/program requirements, and submit a Senior Audit form to graduate.
- All Students are required to complete a capstone before graduating. Consult with your advisor on how best to fill this requirement.
- You may declare a major in the beginning of the first year fall semester. You must declare a major prior to earning 80 credits.
