#### **Welcome to Advanced/ Technical Theater!**

Welcome to our collective journey through the great world of theater and storytelling! I am so excited to begin the new school year with you all! I am delighted to be here and learn the art of theater with you.

# **Course Description**

**Theater** is designed to give students a closer look at the art of Theatre. This class is designed to expand foundational acting and production skills. Each semester culminates with a public performance showcasing the skills learned and honed during class time such as, character building, voice work, improvisation, script analysis, and other acting techniques. **Advanced Theatre** is designed to allow seniors to take on leadership roles. These students will work closely with the teacher to see that all parts of the show create a cohesive production. Advanced students will also complete a passion project that helps improve the theatre department.

#### **Course Objectives**

The student will demonstrate the ability to:

- dramatize ideas and events using linear and non-linear plot lines
- perform ideas and event though movement, speech, and staging for an intended audience
- analyze and evaluate audience/performance relationships
- Analyze and evaluate connections between theater and society

## **Theater Code of Ethics**

A part of the great tradition of theatre is the code of ethics. These are not superstitions or laws, but the attitude expected of all students of the art.

- I shall never miss a performance
- I shall play every performance with energy, enthusiasm and to the best of my ability regardless of size of audience, personal feelings, weather, etc.
- I shall forego all social activities which interfere with rehearsals or performances, and I shall be on time
- I shall never make a curtain late by my failure to be ready on time
- I shall never miss an entrance
- I shall not let the comments of friends, relatives or critics change any phase of my work without proper consultation; I shall not change lines, business, lights, properties, settings or costumes or any phase of the production without consultation with and permission director
- I shall forego the gratification of my ego for the demands of the play
- I shall remember my business is to create illusion; therefore I shall not break the illusion by appearing in costume and makeup off-stage or outside the theater
- I shall accept my director's advice and counsel in the spirit in which is is given, for they can see the production as a whole and my work from the front
- I shall never "put on an act" while viewing other artists' work as a member of an audience, nor shall I make caustic criticism from jealousy or for the sake of being smart
- I shall respect the play and the playwright, and I shall not condemn a play while it is in rehearsal
- I SHALL respect the theater space, work space, dressing rooms etc. by keeping it looking clean, orderly and attractive regardless of whether I am specifically assigned such work or not
- I SHALL handle stage props and costumes with care for I know they are part of the tools of my trade and an vital part of the production
- I SHALL follow rules of courtesy common decency applicable in all walks of life, and will follow the rules and regulations of the school
- I shall NEVER lose my enthusiasm for the theatre because of disappointments

#### **ILYGA Policy**

It is my hope that, as we get to know each other, you will feel comfortable speaking in class, asking "dumb" questions, and talking to me. While I will expect great things from you in this class, I understand that crazy things happen in life. High school can be hard, I know! # **Intellectual Property Rights**

All work should be your own. Plagiarism is CHEATING and will result in a 0 in the gradebook, a contact with parents, and no opportunity to retake the assignment or assessment. When students use materials created by others in e-learning assignments without proper citation, they are guilty of plagiarism which is not only against policy, but also illegal. This includes copying from published works, but also from other students. In addition, using the internet instead of reading or telling other students what is on an assessment is considered ACADEMIC FRAUD. Just **DON'T** do it!

<u>AI</u>: Artificial intelligence is a part of our lives more and more. While I believe AI can be used in beneficial ways, it also can simply be used to cheat. Depending on the assignment, students may be allowed AI for brainstorming, editing, spellcheck, grammar, and organization. The use of AI must be cited. However, you are not allowed to simply copy and paste information from AI. You must learn to communicate without the use of assistance as it develops critical thinking skills. In addition, AI often uses false information and inaccurate citations, which is simply bad writing. AI can be used at teacher's discretion. If you have a question at any time whether the use of AI is allowed on an assignment, please ask me.

#### **Grading**

In addition to regular course work, students will receive a weekly participation grade based on attendance and participation. This is a pass/ fail grade. ANY unexcused absences will result in a 0 for that week. These daily work points can not be made up.
