## 3.0 Championship Fees

The Junior Nationals will be subsidized by funds from the CKF and from the generous donation of individuals and businesses. Participation fees help to cover some of the cost of making this event possible.

Fees are paid by the registering club and can be paid via eTransfer by **May 3rd, 2025**. Please note "Junior Nationals-*club name*" on your eTransfer to treasurer@kendo-canada.com.

Participation fee is \$75 per individual competitor and \$50 per club team submitted. No fee is collected for Provincial Teams. Individual competitor fees include registration to the tournament, lunch, and attendance to the social event.

### 3.1 Individual Competitor Divisions

The goal of the CKF is to ensure that competitors have several opportunities to compete. As the number of competitors and teams is unclear at this time, the divisions set below may change due to the number of submissions in each division. **Club registrations are due April 5th**, **2025**.

<sup>\*</sup>Divisions may be adjusted based on final entries. Final divisions will be communicated by May 3, 2025.

After each individual division the first place winner will be awarded the Canadian National Champion title, and one second place, and two third place finishers will be awarded. For each individual division, there will also be a Fighting Spirit award based on the recommendations of the judges and officials.

#### 3.2 Club Teams

All Club Teams will be 3-person teams. Clubs can submit up to three teams for each team division. Club Teams with only 2 players may still submit a team and the Chuken (middle) position will be forfeited.

Mixed club teams will be created by the organizers based on athletes not participating in a club or provincial team. Please mark "NO" for those not participating in Club Teams. We will do our best to place these players into mixed teams.

#### 3.3 Provincial Team

The Girls Provincial Team will be made up of 3 players and is open to all ages. Teams can be submitted with a minimum of 2 players. Two spare players may be submitted and substituted in.

The Open Provincial Teams will be made up of 5 players. Teams can be submitted with a minimum of 3 players. Provincial Team is open to all ages and genders. A single player can be on either the Girls or Open Team but not both.

As in past championships, we ask each province to establish a selection process that should include but is not limited to a round-robin or based on tournament results.

The Provincial Team lineup and name of Provincial Coach will be submitted by the Provincial Liaison by **April 29, 2025**. Players must be a registered member of a club in the province being represented.

# 4.0 Referee (Shinpan) Training

To ensure a positive experience for the athletes attending the Junior Nationals, shinpan will also need to hone their skills and be trained on all current tournament rules as outlined by the All Japan Kendo Federation.

The CKF encourages provinces to host referee training. Please be sure to have at least one senior member of your club attend the seminar and pass along information to athletes and other referees.

Shinpan candidates must be 4 Dan and over and be actively practicing kendo. Shinpan should be versed on all technical aspects of refereeing and be skilled in discerning *yukoudatotsu* (valid strike). Shinpan lists will be submitted through the provincial liaison by **April 26**, **2025** and final

approval of Shinpan will be determined by the CKF National Chief Examiner.

We need the support of all senior kendo leaders across Canada to make this Junior Nationals a success. We cannot have a tournament without Shinpan. We ask for your support through volunteering your time to these Championships.

# 5.0 Refereeing Rules & Regulations

The tournament rules will follow "<u>The Regulations of Kendo Shiai and Shinpan</u> (September 2nd, 2017 - "The Regulations" and <u>subsequent corrections</u>)", published by International

Kendo Federation (FIK). In addition, Shinpan will apply the <u>Provisional Match and Referee</u> <u>Rules as</u> developed by All Japan Kendo Federation (ZNKR).

Shinpan are required to bring their own flags.

# 6.0 Tournaments and Pools

Individual and Team matches will be 3 minutes for all matches. The number and length of encho (overtime) will be determined once we know the number of participants.

As much as possible, individual and team competitions will begin with a round-robin pool format. After the pool, the tournament will follow the single-elimination tournament format.

# 7.0 Shinai Regulations

The shinai will follow the requirements as illustrated in the <u>"The Regulations of Kendo Shiai and Shinpan"</u> (Revised September 2nd, 2017), published by FIK (see page 22).


Shinai Inspection will be conducted for all players in the U19 division, only.

Figure 1: Specifications of Shinai



# 8.0 Qualifications of Participants and Requirements

The goal of the CKF with Junior Nationals is to provide a meaningful opportunity to compete, for all youth athletes practicing kendo across Canada. The requirements for participation are meant to provide inclusion to all CKF members and not to intentionally exclude any youth athletes.

- 1. Each participant must be a current member of the CKF with 2025 membership fees paid.
- 2. Each participant must be a member of an active CKF club and registration to the Championships must be through the member club.
- 3. All participants must be born on or after January 1, 2007.

Although Canadian citizenship is not a qualification of this event, we will

For individuals participating in the individual divisions and Club Teams, competitors must wear a *zekken* (name tag) that shows the name of their club and the name matching the name submitted in the registration.

Provincial *zekken* (name tags) are optional but recommended. Individuals participating in the Provincial Teams may wear their club or provincial *zekken*. The name on the *zekken* must match the name submitted in the registration.

Each Club is required to prepare their own *tasuki* (red and white ribbons) for individual and Club Teams. Each club is responsible for putting *tasuki* on their own players.

### 9.0 Waiver and Photo Release

The CKF will require all participants to complete a Liability Waiver to participate in Junior Nationals. Individuals cannot participate without a signed waiver. Participants will also be asked to sign a photo release form. Both Liability Waiver and Photo Release only be shared with clubs participating in the Championships.
