S5 Subject Choice – 2026/2027

In February, our S5 learners will make decisions regarding their subject choices for S6 and for post-school plans. As S5 pupils move into S6 they will be looking to choose a minimum of 4 subjects at SCQF level 5/6/7. In S6, we would recommend a blend of subjects previously studied alongside picking up subjects linked to their progression pathway. Aberdeen City Schools also have the option of choosing subjects from ABZ campus which includes subjects taught in other schools and at NESCOL.

In some cases, pupils may look to break their current pathway and crash a subject. This could be a sideways or backwards step in terms of presentation to pick up a new subject e.g N5 and Higher Biology to Higher Chemistry having not studied N5.

From last academic session we moved to a free choice model for our course choice. This means that young people going into S5 and S6 will simply have to select their options from the range offered below (some subjects may still be added to this over the next few weeks). The ABZ offer will continue to run on set afternoons, and this will be reflected on the course choice sheet.

Faculty Curricular Evening/Course Choice Event	Thursday 19 th February 4.30-7pm	All Faculties across the school will be offering drop-in sessions to go through courses on offer, pathways, progression routes and support parents and pupils making their choices. In addition, there will also be a drop-in room to discuss the course choice process with Skills Development Scotland, RGU and Depute responsible for curriculum. Presentations will run at various times throughout the evening: 4.45-5.05pm, 5.40-6pm, 6.30-6.50pm.
Subject choice process	Monday 12 th February until Friday 27 th February	Learners can opt to have a meeting with an allocated member of the Guidance team to discuss subjects and will then take home the subject choice sheet. This will need to be returned by Wednesday 4 th March.

- Use the school report to identify key areas of strength
- Help ensure the course sheet is returned by the deadline
