It looks like there are 5 mandatory courses for 9th graders. With the need to take math and world language, there isn't any room to take an elective like Jazz Band. Is there flexibility on when to take the mandatory courses?	There are 4 pre-assigned, required courses in 9th grade: English 9, Ethnic Studies/Health (1 semester each), PE 9, and Biology. The fifth course is a Math class, which depends on the student's current 8th grade math course. The sixth course is an elective option, which could be World Language or Band, in your case. If your student would like to take a 7-period schedule, World Language would be course #6 and Band would be course #7. Note: World Language is not required in 9th grade. Students may choose to begin World Language coursework in 10th grade and will have enough time to complete 3 levels of that World Language (level 1 in 10th, level 2 in 11th, level 3 in 12th), as recommended for 4-year college admissions. This is a rigorous fast paced course covering the State of California Common Core Algebra 2 Standards, Precalculus, and the Common Core (+) standards which include advanced trigonometric concepts. This course will emphasize use of the Eight Mathematical Practices. Students will make sense of problem situations, solve higher order thinking problems, derive key theorems, use technology where appropriate, work in groups to develop teamwork skills, and demonstrate procedural fluency in their responses. What is the advantage of taking accelerated Algebra 2 instead of regular Algebra 2 as a 9th grader in regards to UC college requirements (currently taking geometry in 8th grade with an A grade)?	The Accelerated Algebra 2 course covers the yearlong Algebra 2 curriculum as well as the yearlong Honors Pre-Calculus curriculum over the course of one year. In other words, students in Accelerated Algebra 2 are completing 2 years of math in 1 year, at an extremely fast pace. A student who successfully completed Accelerated Algebra 2 in 9th grade may then take college-prep Calculus or AP Calculus AB in 10th grade, AP Calculus AB or AP Calculus BC in 11th grade (respectively), and college-prep Statistics or AP Statistics in 12th grade. What is the impact of taking "Accelerated Algebra 2" vs. regular "Algebra 2" on the student's GPA? Is BYU Independent a recognized institution for non-district courses. Can I bridge Biology over this summer(2025 summer). If I did would I be able to take Chemistry in the Earth systems in 9th grade. There is Biology 1 and Biology 2 in BYU, would both these courses count to 4 units.	Please review the Non-District Course Policy and confirm that the outside institution (ex: BYU Independent Study High School) is accredited, and the specific Biology course at the institution is listed on the UC/CSU database of approved courses for the 2024-25 & 2025-26 academic years. The links to the accreditation information and the UC/CSU database are available on the Non-District Course Policy website linked above. After researching and confirming the non-district institution and course meets the policy requirements, submit the Non-District Course Intent Form linked on the policy website. However, students who earn a qualifying score on the World Language AP exam (if offered by <u>Collegeboard</u>) may use their AP exam score to meet the UC/CSU World Language requirement with no coursework required. One person may find a subject/course interesting while someone else finds it uninteresting (which sometimes translates to more difficult, because we typically perform better in courses that are interesting to us). Is 4 years of a language any better to colleges than 3?	Many 4-year colleges recommend that students take 3 years of a world language. Many schools also like to see students demonstrate consistent interest in multi-year programs available at their high school. Consistent interest/involvement could be taking 4 years of a world language or taking Journalism or Theatre or Instrumental Music for more than 1 year in high school.	World Language
