

LMMD - Lake Mason Management District Special Board Meeting Minutes Thursday, January 27th, 2022- 6:00pm Briggsville, WI Town Hall

AGENDA:

- 1. Call Meeting to Order
 - a. Meeting was called to order by Pam Klein, Board Chairperson at 6:00pm
- 2. Check for Open Meeting Law Compliance Proof of Posting
 - a. Klein reported that with the help of the Board, Board Agenda was posted at the Briggsville Post Office, Mason Station, and The Briggsville Fire Department. In addition, the Agenda was also posted on our LMMD Facebook page, the LMMD Website, and an email was sent to residents who subscribe to the email list.

- 4. Approval/Adoption of Agenda
 - a. Brancel made a motion to approve agenda
 - b. Hillard made a second
 - c. So moved
- 5. Treasurer's Report and Outstanding Bills

- 6. Approval of Treasurer's Report and Approval of Bill Payments

- 7. Healthy Lakes and Rivers Grant

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Update on DNR Grant Pre-Application Pam
 - a. After much discussion with the DNR, and having first round grant success, the LMMD was unable to move forward with the DNR Grant for \$25,000. While eager, the grant industry was extremely competitive this past year and while we had a discussion with Onterra, LLC, they were unable to work with us as they were at capacity.
- 2. Welcome new Board Member, Gerald Kopping Secretary
- 3. Report on Joint Meeting with LMMD and Adams and Marquette County Land Conservation Department Jim Brancel
 - a. In order to address nutrient loading and a lake drawdown which includes poisoning and restocking, the lake district needs to hire a firm to draw up a Lake Management (watershed) Plan to secure grant monies to achieve both objectives. To start the wheels turning we voted to spend 5-7 thousand dollars for a contract fisherman to net carp, mark the fish, release them and recapture them to establish the number of carp/acre. This would allow a commercial rough fish firm to harvest carp for 3 years. This data would also be used to support a drawdown, poisoning, and restocking to occur.
 - b. We need volunteers to serve on a committee to interview grant writing firms and choose one. ASAP, Please step forward to help us out. No committee, **Nothing happens!!!!**
 - c. We also need a volunteer(s) to continue the Water Monitoring of the Lake. (3 times a year) end of June, July, and August. Training provided. Just need access to a boat to draw samples.
- 4. Winter Drawdown Update Craig Hillard
 - a. Craig informed the residents and Board that the lake was drawn down a total of 10 inches.

NEW BUSINESS - DISCUSS AND/OR BOARD APPROVAL

- LMMD in comparison to the association Bob Salamon
 LMMD has been utilizing the Lake Mason Improvement Association's EIN and tax-exempt certificate. The tax exempt status recently expired.

 - a. Bob made the recommendation to reinstate a legal retainer as we move forward.

 The EIN and tax exempt certificate are now in place for the LMMD. Copies of the
 documents were shared with several board members beyond the treasurer.

 - b. Pam Klein made the motion for the LMMD to set aside a total of \$600 for up to 3 local residents to attend one, two, or both days of this convention at the expense of LMMD.  - d. Pam Klein made a motion for \$5,000-\$7,000 be set aside, per recommendation from Jennifer Bergman from the DNR, for a Fall Survey. This data will be incredibly important as we work to get a rough fish removal permit as well as plan for our lake improvements grants.
