Principal's Message

At Corunna High School, we are committed to helping every student reach their full academic potential. One of our academic goals is to increase all students' SAT scores, with the ultimate aim of reaching an average score of 1100 at CHS. This goal supports our District's Mission in ways of increased opportunities with college admissions, scholarship opportunities, and future readiness.

FREE SAT PREP OVER THE SUMMER

To help students stay sharp and continue progressing toward this goal, we highly encourage all students to study over the summer using free SAT practice tools from the College Board. The official College Board site offers personalized practice based on your student's previous PSAT/SAT scores. SUMMER SLIDE

It is important that students avoid the “**summer slide**,” a well-documented learning loss that occurs when academic practice stops over breaks. Studies show that after just two weeks, students begin to lose retention and recall of key academic skills they learned over the course of the year. Academic researchers suggest that: (1) on average, students’ achievement scores declined over summer vacation by one month’s worth of school-year learning, (2) declines were sharper for math and reading, and (3) the extent of loss was larger at higher grade levels.” Having your child read and practice math problems over summer break can keep the summer slide at bay, and practicing SAT questions can help stop the **summer slide**.

NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP QUALIFYING TEST (NMSQT)

We are excited to offer the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT) on campus this October for interested CHS 10th and 11th graders. The cost of the exam is \$25, and it serves multiple purposes:

- Prepares students for the SAT
- Identifies students for scholarship and recognition opportunities (National Merit Scholar winner!)
- Provides feedback on college and career readiness
