Malaysia Eyes ENC 2026 MLBB Challenge as Esports Nations Cup Confirms Official Rosters

Riyadh, Saudi Arabia (June 8, 2026) - The Esports Foundation (EF) today confirmed the official roster submissions for the Mobile Legends: Bang Bang (MLBB) tournament at the [Esports Nations Cup 2026](#) (ENC), the global nation-based esports competition set to debut in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia from November 2-29, 2026.

107 rosters representing 107 countries and territories have been officially submitted and confirmed for the MLBB tournament. While there is still significant time between now and the official ranking cut-off on August 2 that determines direct invites to the ENC 2026 Finals, the submitted rosters indicate some exciting teams that will command worldwide attention in November.

Malaysia has officially submitted its MLBB roster, according to National Team Manager Amir Syafiq bin Abd Rashid. The lineup features a mix of experienced veterans and emerging young talent drawn from several organizations within the local MLBB ecosystem, including Team Vamos, Bigetron MY by VIT, and Team Rey.

Submitted players include Loleal, Martzy, Sizkaa, Chibi, Zqeef and Xorn, reflecting MESF's emphasis on building a balanced squad that combines experienced veterans with younger-generation talent.

Amir highlighted veteran MPL Malaysia player [Chibi](#) as one of the country's "legendary" MLBB players, while also pointing to rising young talent [Zqeef](#), who recently competed in the MPL Malaysia Season 17 Grand Final and qualified for the MLBB Mid Season Cup at EWC 2026 in Paris following strong performances in the local professional scene.

According to Amir, Malaysia's strategy for ENC 2026 focuses on balancing veteran players with younger talent as part of a longer-term player development approach for the national MLBB ecosystem.

Under this approach, Malaysia is expected to be among the Southeast Asian nations closely watched heading into the competition, supported by a passionate fanbase and a competitive ecosystem that has consistently produced standout MLBB talent on the international stage. The country currently sits 17th in the ENC 2026 MLBB rankings with 1,550 points, strengthening Malaysia's position in the race for direct qualification to the ENC Finals. With the rankings still subject to change ahead of the August 2 cutoff, teams across Southeast Asia will be looking to strengthen their positions in the push for direct qualification.

Across Southeast Asia, several countries and territories are assembling star-studded national rosters by combining elite player cores under a single banner. The Philippines and Indonesia are all expected to field highly competitive lineups featuring players from leading MLBB organizations, further intensifying regional rivalries heading into ENC 2026.

Unlike several nations opting for all-star roster constructions, the appointed coaching team has chosen a more balanced squad composition for this round that combines established names with younger-generation players. The selection process took place ahead of the conclusion of the current local MLBB season, leading the federation to adopt a broader long-term development strategy that balances proven veterans with emerging players.

The Team Falcons PH roster isn't the only roster representing the two-time Club Championship winning organization in MLBB at the ENC. Falcons' MENA trio of Saano, Trolli, and Cuffin will lead Saudi Arabia alongside K7 and Arshven.

MESF believes Southeast Asia will once again remain the strongest competitive region for MLBB at ENC 2026, with Malaysia expected to face stiff competition from regional powerhouses such as the Philippines and Indonesia.

With still almost two months until the national rankings are finalized, this year's [MLBB Mid Season Cup \(MSC\) at EWC 2026](#) in Paris will play a major role in determining which countries and territories will be among the top 16 invited directly to the ENC Finals. 14 of the remaining spots will be determined by online regional qualifiers held between August 14-16. The final two teams will qualify through Wildcard slots.

"We have very high hopes for MLBB at ENC 2026," said Amir. "Rather than focusing purely on an all-star lineup, we wanted to build a balanced squad that combines experienced players with



emerging talent. We believe this approach not only strengthens Malaysia's competitiveness at ENC 2026, but also supports the long-term growth of the country's MLBB ecosystem."

MLBB continues to be one of Malaysia's most popular esports titles, with MESF describing MPL Malaysia as one of the country's biggest and most developed esports ecosystems.

MESF also confirmed it is working closely with MPL Malaysia stakeholders to support the national team selection process and long-term ecosystem planning.

The Esports Nations Cup (ENC) is a biennial global esports competition created by the Esports Foundation (EF) that brings national pride to the world stage. Launching in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, in 2026, the ENC will feature the world's best players competing not for their clubs, but for their countries and territories, across a lineup of leading esports titles. Built in collaboration with game partners, clubs, and esports organizations, the ENC establishes the first recurring, large-scale platform for national teams in esports.
