Principles of Leadership is a two-semester course that combines high-level critical thinking, writing, and analytical skills with mentorship and entrepreneurial project experiences and implementation. Students will participate in research and evaluation, project planning and execution, as well as leadership and critical thinking-based activities in order to further develop these key skills in tandem with mentorship and counselling of fellow students. Students will learn vital theoretical lessons in the area of interpersonal communications, diversity and inclusion, marketing, advertising, and pedagogy.

Course description

AVID – Advancement Via Individual Determination: this program provides support to the academic middle students who wish to take advanced classes. An application is required. Students in the AVID program that have an AP course on their schedule will be placed in AVID junior seminar during 11th grade and AVID senior seminar during 12th grade. This course will provide the same academic support and follow the same curriculum as the regular AVID ¾ class but will give students the opportunity to earn a year of college prep elective credit by completing both the junior and senior seminar class.
