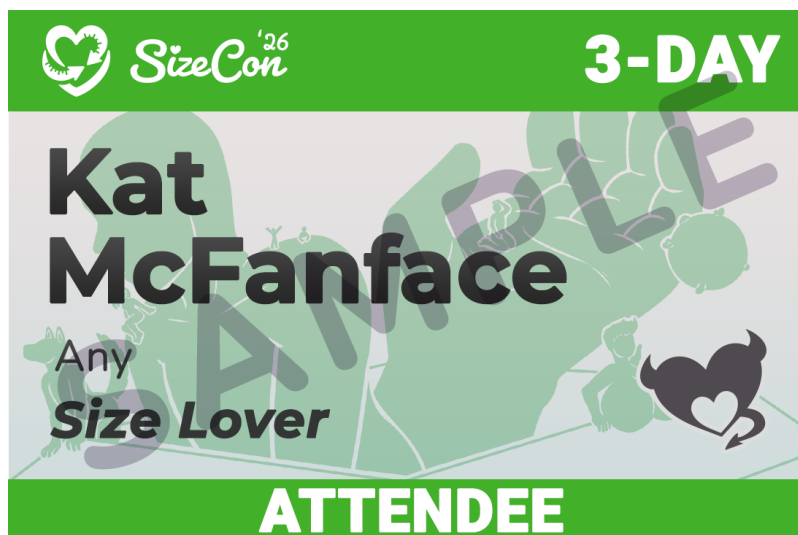
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Don't forget to register your badge!

Registration to ensure a printed badge passed on March 9th, 2026. To register, you'll need to have your Eventbrite ticket purchase receipt handy to input your Order # OR provide us your full name so we can verify the badge being claimed has indeed been purchased.



Please note, if you purchased multiple tickets for others within your order, each member in your party will need to fill out the badge registration as well. We highly encourage you to forward them this email and provide them with your Order # or Full name so that they may register their badge as well.

Ready to skip the line?

After purchasing your ticket, you should receive an email about [Vouched.id](#). This is a service we use to verify IDs to prevent minors and those on our ban list from attending SizeCon. The Vouched process is only required for **first-time attendees** of any of our in-person or online events.

While the [Vouched.id](#) step is required for our online events, it is **highly recommended** for our in-person events, as it will help considerably with check-in times for all attendees. If you do not complete Vouched.id ahead of time, you will

need to present your government-issued ID at our badge pickup table before receiving your SizeCon entry badge and any meal tickets you may have purchased.

If you believe you need a Vouched email but did not receive one, please contact production@sizecon.com and we'll be happy to help.

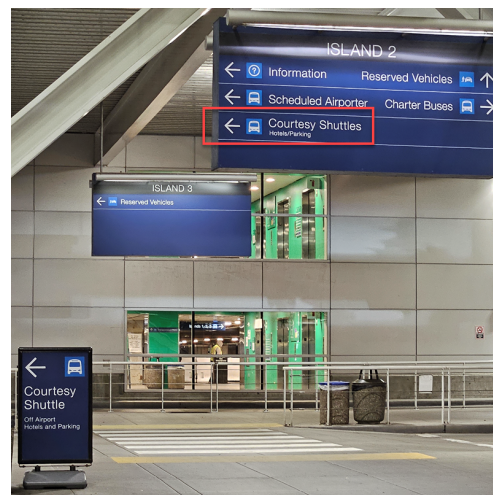
♥ TRAVEL & LODGING ♥

If you haven't finalized your travel plans yet, this is what you should know. We will be hosting SizeCon at the Sheraton Portland Airport Hotel located at:

Via Plane (Hotel Shuttle to/from PDX) ✈️ 🚆 🏠

Transportation from PDX Airport to the PDX Sheraton is free via complimentary shuttle. When you arrive, look for signs for Courtesy Shuttles to Hotels/Parking. You can call the hotel (+1 503-281-2500) once at the shuttle area to request a shuttle to pick you up. They may already tell you one is on their way, or ask you the party size and send one out. The hotel is very close, so you will not be waiting long!

Please use [Google Maps](#) to find the best route to the hotel. Parking is FREE! If you're looking for a carpool, or willing to volunteer some room in your car for fellow SizeCon attendees you can join our [SizeCon Discord](#) Ride & Roomshare Channel and be part of a volunteer carpool!

By Transit (TriMet/MAX)

For visiting Downtown Portland and coming/returning to the Convention, you may use the TriMet/MAX. TriMet fare for MAX trains and TriMet buses is \$2.60/2.5 hours or \$5.20/day. The Red line arrives at and departs from the airport roughly every 15 minutes from 4:59 AM to 12:29 AM, with availability every 30 minutes in the early morning and late evening. The Red line runs through Downtown Portland, Washington Park (home to the Oregon Zoo), and many other popular attractions, but

if you need a connection, download the Hop Fastpass app ([Google Play](#) | [iOS](#)) to view route availability and plan your trip. To return to the hotel, take the Red Line to the Portland Airport and follow the signs to Island 2 to get a complimentary shuttle back to the hotel. (See "[By Plane](#)" instructions.)

Is your Hotel Room Booked?

If you haven't booked a room yet, don't panic, there's still time! Booking can be done [online](#) or by calling (503) 281-2500. The reduced SizeCon rate for 2026 has already passed, but please call or email:

And they can help you get the SizeCon rate or to add additional nights under the rate – be sure to mention you're attending "SizeCon." (Past March 1, no guarantee of con rate.) Don't fret about discussing the convention over the phone with them. The same hotel hosts [Furlandia](#) every year. They're professionals.

If you accidentally booked online WITHOUT using our group link, please contact the hotel to get your reservation corrected. Not only will you be paying more by having booked outside our group, but you'll also be separated on another floor far from other attendee rooms and SizeCon security.

Have you packed the essentials?

Make sure you've remembered to pack all your essentials, like your toothbrush, medications and phone charger. Late-March in Portland, OR tends to be overcast and chilly, around 56° F (~13° C), so bring appropriate clothing for the weather. Also, don't forget to leave a little extra room in your suitcase for SizeCon swag

Additional tips for Portland: layers are always a good thing particularly during early spring with temperatures varying as well as moving from indoor to outdoor

areas. SizeCon will have coat racks at the entrances to both major con spaces (Mt. Hood and Mt. St. Helens) so you are able to wear a jacket/cover-up in hotel public spaces and then walk con spaces more freely.

What should I wear?!

Most SizeCon guests typically wear casual clothing, jeans, t-shirts and comfortable shoes - remember you will be on your feet a lot! However, guests are free to dress however they'd like, including sexy and/or kink-related outfits, assuming it's not any more revealing than what you'd typically see at the beach. **Yes, that means you can't be naked at SizeCon.**

Costuming is allowed and even encouraged (especially if it's size-related!), whether that be a cosplay of your favorite character or your fiercest looking drag, we're here to celebrate, so go on and express yourself!

Please note, guests may wear face-concealing masks, makeup, etc, as long as they are not too upsetting (i.e. Jason mask, Ski mask, grotesque prosthetics, etc). 🤩 These rules also apply for our online SizeCon [micro] events too.

Bodysuits and prosthetics are welcome, and you will see many bodies "expanded" in this way on the con floor! However, we do not permit direct body inflation or mutilation via liquid, air, or other methods as this can create a health hazard and potential bodily harm SizeCon is not staffed to cover.

Again, please be extra mindful of nudity in public areas of our host hotel (this includes the pool!), as we'd like to be invited back - thank you!



Read the rules

Pay close attention! The rules are important, and our SizeCon staff enforces them very strictly for the protection of the event, the attendees, and the hotel. Look for the rules [on the event website](#) and companion app, study them, ask our staff if you have any questions, and make sure you understand them.

Please listen closely to instructions given by staff. At kink events, as in the legal system, ignorance of the law is no defense! Let's keep SizeCon safe and welcoming for everyone! We do take bans seriously, and if you break the rules you are at risk of a temporary or even permanent ban from attending future SizeCon events, in-person and online.

R.E.S.P.E.C.T.

Be respectful, courteous, and tolerant of others. Vanilla manners are never out of place! While our badge system should help, if you don't know how to address someone, ASK! If you're not sure what someone's kink is, ASK! If you're not sure what someone's preferences are, ASK!

Don't assume people's pronouns based on appearance or presentation. Don't assume the person you're speaking to has the same exact kink as you. Do not sexualize others without consent! Make everyone feel included by educating yourself and being mindful of your words and actions.

If you make a mistake or find yourself in an uncomfortable situation, an apology would be appropriate. They will very likely understand. We were all new to this at one time, and we remember what it was like to make mistakes.

Photography and Videography

Given we are a kink convention, people who attend have various levels of privacy they wish to keep in place. Some do not mind being part of photos, some definitely do NOT want to be photographed. To help ensure we make the area a safe-zone for people's privacy, but also ensure we can capture great photos and videos with consent, we have set up a couple of procedures we want everyone to keep in mind and follow:

- 1) We are handing out bright orange bracelets for those who **DO NOT** wish to be photographed or recorded - these can be obtained during front desk

registration. Our hope is that this will reduce some friction or awkwardness about who is OK having their photo taken and who is not.

- 2) We will continue to enforce tape/stickers covering phone cameras. These will be handed out during registration and we ask that you keep these on for the entirety of the convention - with the only exception during convention hours being if you are taking a consensual photo in a safe, unpopulated area. Ask if you need replacements to cover your camera - security will be watching for uncovered phones.
- 3) We will have a designated photo area this year. We are happy to provide this space to allow for worry-free, creative photo opportunities, and this area will be in Cascade C.
- 4) No photography or videos during events, UNLESS the performer has given consent beforehand AND if they are the only one in the shot. (Game shows, talent shows, karaoke included)
- 5) We'll have a photographer and videographer on hand to capture SizeCon approved events and vendors and attendees with consent. If you see them and they are free, don't be afraid to suggest a photo op or video op they could take involving yourself and friends.

And most importantly - **remember TO ASK**. Even if you don't see a bracelet, that doesn't mean you can snap a photo - obtain permission before taking **any** photos or recording video. Thank you for respecting everyone's space and privacy!

Come with a very open mind!

You will see lots of different kinds of people, hear lots of different viewpoints and opinions, and see lots of different kinds of relationships and different kinds of play. People tend to "pull out all the stops" at these events, and some of what you see at SizeCon may or may not be surprising to you. It's all good, and it's all a learning experience. (Even just thinking about *why* you reacted in a certain way to something can be a valuable learning process.) Be respectful, courteous, and tolerant of others. Remember, participating in anything at SizeCon is always voluntary.

Please treat our Equipment with T.L.C.!

SizeCon first and foremost is a community-run event. We break even most years, meaning that all of our equipment is either rented, donated or borrowed. Please, we implore you to be careful and respectful with what you use at SizeCon, especially our more expensive stuff (Computers, Game Systems, BDSM equipment, etc). If you're not sure how to use something, please ask. (We have helpful tech staff nearby for our tech-dependent events!)

♥ HEALTH & PERSONAL CARE ♥

Don't be HANGRY..

It's easy to forget when there is so much going on, but food is important and provides the energy necessary to socialize, play, shop and be engaged in classes, socials and panels. Fortunately, you've got options!

The SizeCon meal plan costs \$75 (plus tax) per day, covering buffet-style breakfast, lunch, and dinner. It must be purchased for each day or for the weekend, as individual meal purchases are not available. **All meal plans must be purchased by Saturday March 21st, 2026**, as we need to provide the hotel with numbers. A limited number of daily meal plan tickets will be available on-site, but we cannot guarantee availability. Reasons to consider the meal plan:

- It helps the con meet our food minimum. Help us stay in the black!
- Eat with fellow attendees in the convention space.
- It's all-you-can eat, gorge to your heart's content (if you're into that)
- Convenient—no need to leave or worry about delivery.
- Tasty options—[check out the menu!](#)

If you choose not to purchase the SizeCon meal plan, there are additional food options from [nearby restaurants at Cascade Station](#) (5-min. drive or 20-min. walk) as well as fast food options [in the greater vicinity](#). If you're staying at the hotel, you may also bring your own food to keep in your room, **though outside food is not allowed in the con**. A mini-fridge is provided in every room and a shared microwave for guest use is available in the lobby café.

Get some sleep!

You should expect that your sleep times may change (many attendees will be significantly changing timezones!). You might be up early for breakfast and back to bed late after playtime hours. You meet people, you make friends, plans can change. A minimum of 5 hours of sleep per day is highly recommended, though of course if you could get a healthier 7-8 hours, you should. Preferably sleeping in a bed. It doesn't have to be your bed, but you **MUST** have permission if it's not!

And don't forget to shower!

For the love of <insert Deity of choice here>, take a shower. A minimum of 1 shower per day is strongly recommended. With all of the BUSY going on, it can be something that's missed, but please insert it into your daily schedule. Con Funk is

not pleasant for your fellow attendees around you, and while this has never been a serious issue at SizeCon before, it does happen at adult cons and fan cons, so please think of your fellow con-goers! Showers are free to all hotel guests. If you don't have a room, ask a friend to use their shower. Patchouli oil, extra deodorant, FeBreeze, cologne, or a fresh change of clothes does not replace a shower 100% or at all. Please shower!

SAFETY & CON OPERATIONS

SizeCon Security

2026 is no different; we have a wonderful group of volunteers who will be dedicated to making SizeCon safe for everyone! Marked Security with walkie-talkies will be patrolling the SizeCon floor for your safety. (Marked with a "Security" badge) If at any point you feel threatened, or need to report someone breaking the rules, please flag down our security staff. If you do not see security near you, approach the Security Desk that will be found in front of Mt. Hood A, or our SizeCon Badge Pickup desk for help (Cascade A&B) and we will get security ASAP. After the convention closes up each night, Security Staff will also be placed on the far end rooms on the floors we have booked out for SizeCon. There will be signage on their room door as well. If there is any emergency, you can call their room or knock on their door for help after hours.

Hotel Staff

Be polite to the hotel staff. It's difficult to handle a weekend with a crowd the size of a typical kink event. You may run into delays getting room services or dealing with problems with your room. The hotel staff is doing the best they can, so please be patient.

Be respectful of the housekeeping staff; don't leave toys and explicit materials laying around the room that they may have to touch or move to get their job done. It's not easy to find a hotel that will host this kind of event, so we need to make a good impression so that we will keep being invited back. Thank the hotel staff any time you talk to them, and don't forget to tip!

Alcohol & Controlled Substances

Oregon law permits marijuana use for adults **21 and over**, but SizeCon policies and hotel policies still apply.

The hotel **does not allow smoking or vaping of any kind indoors**. This includes hotel rooms and convention spaces. Smoking or vaping is only permitted in designated outdoor areas.

If you choose to partake in any other **legal** controlled substances, please do so **discreetly and responsibly**. SizeCon is not responsible for any fines, violations, or law enforcement interactions related to substance use.

Public intoxication (alcohol or other substances) is not permitted in SizeCon convention areas.

Alcoholic beverages must remain in the **hotel bar and lobby areas**. **New for 2026**, alcoholic drinks will not be permitted inside SizeCon convention areas or event spaces. This policy helps ensure a safe and comfortable environment for all attendees.

You are welcome to enjoy the hotel bar offerings, but please drink responsibly. If staff or security believe someone is heavily under the influence (alcohol or other substances), they may be asked to step out of convention areas and will not be permitted to re-enter until security determines they are fit to return.

SizeCon Masking Policy

As with any large, indoor gathering, there is still a potential of contracting Covid-19 (or any other airborne illness for that matter!). With that in mind, **masking is encouraged, but not required**. We will have free masks to all attendees available at the registration desk, but if you have a personal type you prefer, please bring your own mask instead.

COVID & Illness Policy

While COVID precautions have evolved in recent years, SizeCon still takes the health of our community seriously. If a **confirmed COVID case** is reported during the convention, SizeCon staff will notify attendees through our **official communication channels**, including the SizeCon Discord server and via email.

At that time, we will have **masks and rapid tests available for attendees**, and staff working registration and convention operations will begin **masking as an added**

precaution. We strongly encourage attendees to consider masking as well after a confirmed case has been reported.

As always, please be mindful of others. If you are feeling unwell, we encourage you to rest in your room and take advantage of testing resources available during the convention.

2026 - No Kings Protest and ICE

The No Kings protest is expected to take place in **downtown Portland**, on Saturday, March 28, approximately **20–30 minutes by car or public transit** from our hotel, which is located adjacent to Portland Airport. The convention itself is not taking place downtown.

SizeCon supports the right to protest and stands in solidarity with those advocating for immigrant and civil rights. We recognize that this moment carries real personal stakes for many members of our community, and we respect that people may engage with it in different ways.

We do not expect the protest to disrupt SizeCon programming or access to the hotel. As a publicly accessible building, the hotel lobby is legally open to the public. However, **ICE cannot enter or search SizeCon convention spaces, guest rooms, or restricted hotel areas (such as the pool or gym) without a warrant.**

Within our convention spaces, we are committed to maintaining a **safe and privacy-respecting environment** for all attendees. We are coordinating closely with the hotel and our internal security team to uphold clear boundaries around event areas throughout the weekend.

Attendees are free to participate in the protest if they choose. We encourage anyone who plans to attend to:

- Allow extra travel time,
- Plan transportation in advance, and
- Make choices that prioritize their personal safety and comfort.
