Ephesians 3:20-21 - Far More Abundantly Really Real Sunday, November 13, 2022

1. How have you seen God at work in your life in unexpected ways recently?

## Reflecting on the Passage

- 1. Review the seven blessings and three prayer petitions Paul offers in Ephesians 1:
  - a. Blessings: Chosen (v. 4); Predestined (v. 5); Redemption (v. 7); Forgiveness (v. 7); Knowing God's will (v.9); Inheritance (v. 11); Sealed with Holy Spirit (v. 13)
  - b. Petitions: The hope of your calling (v.18); the riches of His inheritance (v 18); Greatness of His power (v. 19)
  - c. Which of these blessings/petitions catch your attention and/or grab your heart?
- 2. What does it mean that the church is the "fullness of him who fills all in all"? (1:23)
- 3. What are the ways Paul describes the new humanity in Christ? (2:19-22; 3:6)
- 4. How does Paul's doxology (vss 20-21) serve as a fitting conclusion to the doctrine he has presented in the first three chapters of the letter?

## **Reflecting on your Life**

- 5. What have you learned over the past several weeks from Ephesians 1-3 that has 1) encouraged you as a believer or, 2) enabled you to share the gospel with an unbeliever?
- 6. If Paul were your prayer partner, how might he encourage you in your devotional life?
- 7. In what ways do you find that your limited grasp of your blessedness limits how you pray? How might you grow in the realization that you are praying to a Father who gives lavishly from the abundance of his grace?
- 8. How important to you is a sense of connectedness to the local church body? If you heard that Trinity was about to split on some issue (hypothetically! It's not happening!! :), how would you react? In what ways are you seeking to strengthen the unity of the body?
- 9. Share an experience where you have experienced God answering a prayer with a filling of Himself (his nature, character, attributes).

10. Trace the trajectory in scripture of God's desire to "fill" his creation. Gen. 1:22,28; 6:11-13; Exodus 40:34-35; Psalm 107:9; Isaiah 2:6-8; Habakkuk 2:14; John 1:14-16; Acts 2:2-4; 1 Peter 1:7-9; Revelation 22:1-4
