Was the American Revolution Justified?

Your Task: To answer the question, "was the american revolution justified?" using evidence from history as well as a theory of justice

Resources:

- Stamp act protests
- Sons of liberty
- 7 events that led to the American Revolution: Be sure to click the INTERNAL links in this article as the
 descriptions themselves are likely too brief to be super useful, but all of the 7 events are hyperlinked to more
 detailed treatments.
- Townshend act
- Boston Tea Party; Boston Massacre and Tea Acts
- Intolerable Acts and HERE

Steps:

- 1. Ensure that you are familiar with major historical events (above) and perspectives that led to the revolution
- 2. Ask yourself, "What elements must be present in order for ANY ACT to be justified..." does my answer align with a moral philosophy? If so, identify that philosophy/philosopher.
- 3. Identify acts of injustice that therefore JUSTIFY the protests of the americans and explain those actions and identify specifically WHY they were unjust
- 4. Discuss why REVOLUTION WAS or WAS NOT justified. Of course linking the answers/discussion from step 3 above to this conversation.
- 5. Express your learning in one of the following mediums / product:
 - a. Written
 - b. Video
 - c. Google Slide presentation
