However, there are also regional, state, and national festivals, competitions, travel opportunities, and chances to get involved with activities like the pit orchestra for the annual musical. Marching Band

The BHS Marching Bucs are an instrumental ensemble that performs music and a choreographed show at many different types of events throughout the year. The most commonly seen events are local parades and halftime shows at Friday Night football games. However, they travel to University football games, marching band festivals, and local schools to share ideas and experiences. This group also travels together every other year to places like Disney World, Niagara Falls, and New

Orleans. Members of this group must be enrolled in Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, and/or Percussion courses at BHS.

Band Council

This group of students makes up the leadership team of the BHS band department. Students in this group meet monthly to discuss activities for band students, identify things that can be improved, set up social and outreach activities, and in general serve as peer leaders and role models for the band students. Leadership roles are typically given to veteran members of the high school program, but can be made available to incoming members who are interested.

Mariachi Club

Students have the opportunity to learn violin, guitar, bass/guitarron, trumpet, or vocals. Math Team

In the winter, we have competitions where students compete both individually and as a team. Math Team is open to students of all ages and levels. Scholastic Bowl is open to anyone. In 2023, we were regional champs for the first time in 15 years. It's a lot like Jeopardy! except that you don't answer with a question, and you play as a team against other schools. However, most people who later appear on Jeopardy! and win money (including Ken Jennings, who won about 2 and a half million) did quiz bowl aka Scholastic Bowl in high school and college. You can come to as many practices as you like or even just one to see if it's for you. Topics range over all academic areas and include some pop culture and current events.
