INTRODUCTION (Century Gothic, 11 pt, Bold)

(Century Gothic, 10 pt, 1.15 line spacing). The introduction consists of 300–800 words covering the background, gap analysis, and objectives of the community service project. The background may stem from an actual problem occurring within a specific community or from phenomena observed in the field. This problem has not yet been (or has not been thoroughly) explored by previous community service practitioners, thereby creating a gap that requires a solution through community service. At the end of the introduction, the objectives of the community service project must be stated.

This section contains 150–500 words explaining the methods used to solve (reduce) the problem, as well as the methods for analyzing the program's effectiveness or success. The steps of the methods used may also be illustrated using charts or flowcharts. The methods employed should be grounded in a strong theoretical foundation to ensure their scientific validity. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION (Century Gothic, 11 pt, Bold)

The Results and Discussion section should be 500–1,500 words in length and present the findings from the community service project along with their analysis. Clearly and comprehensively describe the key findings obtained. Findings must be supported by complete and adequate data. The data should be presented in the form of tables, graphs, histograms, or other formats and analyzed

using descriptive analysis or relevant statistical formulas. The Results and Discussion section must address the objectives of the community service program as stated in the introduction.

To support the clarity of the presentation of community service results, tables, figures, or charts may be used in this section. If more than one table, figure, or chart is presented, they must be numbered sequentially starting from number 1 (one). If tables, figures, or charts are presented in other sections of the article, the same rules apply. Please note that in the Results and Discussion section, it is not permitted to include an excessive number of activity images/photos or tables. The maximum number of photos and tables is 5 (five).

CONCLUSION (Century Gothic, 11 pt, Bold)

(Century Gothic, 10 pt, spasi multiple 1,15). The conclusion, consisting of 100–300 words, summarizes the achievement of the community service program's objectives or the findings obtained. The conclusion should not simply repeat the results and discussion, but rather provide a summary of the findings as outlined in the objectives. The recommendations section outlines actions to be taken regarding future directions for the community service initiative.
