

The Google Password Manager: A User's Guide

Google Password Manager helps you securely store, automatically fill, and manage your passwords across devices when you are signed in with your Google Account.

1. Accessing Google Password Manager:

There are three main ways to open it:

- **On the Web (any device):**
 1. Go to passwords.google.com.
 2. Sign in with your Google Account if prompted.
 - **On Chrome (desktop):**
 1. Open Chrome.
 2. Click the **three dots (:)** in the top-right corner.
 3. Go to **Settings > Autofill > Password Manager**.
 - **On Mobile (Android/iOS with Chrome or Google app):**
 1. **Android:** Settings > Google > Manage your Google Account > Security > Password Manager.
 2. **iPhone/iPad:** Use the **Google app** > Tap your profile > Settings > Password Manager.
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2. Saving Passwords:

1. When you log in to a website or app, Google will prompt: **“Save Password?”**
 2. Click **Save** to store it securely.
 3. Your credentials will synchronize across devices where you are signed into your Google Account.
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3. Auto-Filling Passwords:

- **On Chrome or Android apps:**
When you revisit a site or app, your saved username and password will appear automatically. Select your account and Google fills it in.
 - **On iPhone/iPad:**
Enable **Google Password Manager as Autofill provider** under iOS Settings > Passwords > Autofill Passwords.
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4. Managing Saved Passwords:

- Go to passwords.google.com or open **Password Manager** in Chrome/Google app.
 - From here you can:
 - **Search** for a saved login.
 - **View passwords** (requires Google sign-in & device authentication).
 - **Edit or delete** stored passwords.
 - **Export passwords** (for backup or migration; use caution).
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5. Checking Password Security:

Google Password Manager includes a **Password Checkup** tool:

1. Open Password Manager.
 2. Select **Check passwords**.
 3. Google will scan for:
 - Weak passwords.
 - Reused passwords.
 - Compromised passwords (found in known data breaches).
 4. Follow the recommendations to update accounts.
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6. Extra Security Tips:

- Enable and enroll in **2-Step Verification (2FA)** on your Google Account for extra protection.
 - Keep your browser and apps up to date.
 - Regularly review and clean up old or unused saved passwords.
