

Summer Assignment

Inspired by the historical figure of Sarah Grimke, The Invention of Wings tells the story of Sarah's life starting on her eleventh birthday, when she is given ownership of ten-year-old Handful, who is to be her slave. The story follows their remarkable journeys over the next thirty-five years, as both strive for a life of their own, dramatically shaping each other's destinies and forming a complex relationship marked by guilt, defiance, estrangement, and the uneasy ways of love.
