- Collecting information required for this flight
- Weather Information systems
- Required Documents in possession of the pilot

- use the <u>online Flight Service Station</u> briefing or dial 1-800-WX-BRIEF to obtain a weather briefing
- understand the concept of a go/no-go decision based on weather briefing information
- be able to explain the hazards associated with flight in the vicinity of thunderstorms
- exhibit knowledge pertaining to required documents when acting as a pilot in command (pilot's license, photo ID).
