Carter M. Morgan, 79, of 227 Algoma Blvd., died today at 1:25 a.m. at Mercy Medical Center, where he had been a patient five weeks.

He was born in Oshkosh on Oct. 10, 1893, son of Mr. and Mrs. Montrose Morgan, and was married here to Miss Amber Masterson on June 23, 1926.

Mr. Morgan farmed in the Town of Black Wolf until coming to Oshkosh in 1940. He had then been employed at Wisconsin Axle Co. and by the Winnebago County highway department, retiring in 1958.

He served with the Army during World War I, and was a member of Cook-Fuller Post 70 of American Legion and its Last Man's Club. He also was a member of St. Peter Catholic Church and the Oshkosh Ice Fishermen's Club.

Surviving is his widow, Amber.
