On Monday we welcomed 22 new ākonga with a 'whakatau' a traditional Māori welcome led by our ākonga. 18 of these ākonga as new entrants in our reception class - 'Kohanga Kiwi'.

Our plan is to get back to welcoming all new staff, ākonga and whānau at the start of each term as we have done previously.



It was awesome to see lots of whānau on Friday last week when whānau teachers and learning communities were open for visits. Informal feedback from whānau was that this provided a simple, non-threatening way to reassure children. It benefited children who

were feeling a bit anxious and those who could not wait to be back!

#### Our staff are aiming to meet with all whanau as early as possible this year!

Next week - on Wednesday and Thursday we have 'Share and Connect' meetings between whānau and teachers. While we made these bookings available at the end of last year, there are still plenty of spots left. Details about how to book and what to expect are in this newsletter.

#### Haere Mai - Come on In!

Whānau are very welcome and encouraged to be in all Learning Communities from 8.20 am until school starts for the day at 8.45 am.

All Learning Communities are open for children and whānau from 8.20 am every day. This is a time where teachers are available to greet children and whānau, and support settling in for the day.

At the end of the day we ask that whānau of children in the main building wait on the field side of the stairs to avoid congestion. After the main rush of children come down the stairs, you are welcome to go back up to the learning communities with your child. Please be aware that teachers will often have meetings from approximately 3.15pm.

If you need to meet with your child's teacher, please arrange a time to do this with the teacher. It may not be possible to do this in the time immediately before or after school while the teacher is focused on all children.

#### **Emotional Environment**

One of our focuses with teachers in our professional learning days before school started was the E in EPIC - The Emotional Environment. We know that the 'Emotional Environment' plays a crucial part in learning and development for our ākonga. It's also crucial for our staff.

You can see the summaries of our mahi (work) about <u>EPIC environments on our website</u>. It's the framework we use to create the best learning environment possible for our ākonga.







An important part of an EPIC Emotional Environment is 'Relationships'.

You might also be interested in finding out a bit about our staff. Each staff member has made an introduction page which is displayed outside the room or space they are in to help build relationships with ākonga and whānau.





### 2025 Term 1 Share and Connect - Week 2 - Wed 12/2 & Thursday 13/2

The aim of this initial 10 minute meeting - 'Share and Connect' is for teachers, whānau and ākonga to meet in person to start to (or continue) to build strong relationships to support your child's learning. It's about 'whanaungatanga' building connections and relationships

Meetings will focus on whānau, ākonga and teachers sharing information about how the first few days have been, and making plans to support each child's learning in 2025.

We strongly suggest your child is part of this meeting. **Teachers will not be sharing any new achievement information at this meeting**.

We believe this process is a really positive experience that will has a big impact on learning and wellbeing.

Please note that on Wednesday 12 February **school will finish at 1pm** to allow teachers to be involved in these meetings.

#### We would like you to talk to us about your child at the Whānau Connect Meeting

Please take some time to think about the questions below in preparation for your meeting...

- What is your child passionate about or show an interest in?
- What does your child do well or enjoy doing at home and school?
- What have you noticed about learning and school in previous years?
- o How could we build on your child's strengths to support learning?
- o How would you like us to work together this year?
- What is the best way to communicate between your whānau and teacher?
- Is there anything that teachers would benefit from being aware of which might impact on your child's school life?
- Are there any health, well-being or custody factors you would like the teacher to be aware of? (You are welcome to arrange another time if you would like to share this without your child there)

#### **Exciting Renovations!**

Over the break we have had some pretty major interior improvements occur in Rooms 6, 7, 8 - the existing rooms closest to the office/admin. Holes have been cut in walls, new sliding doors added, and wall and floor coverings are being replaced.

What used to be our less attractive learning spaces have become really nice spaces. The internal windows look directly into trees which regularly have native birds in them

These rooms will be used by some of our Kiwi Team. At this stage we have not confirmed when they will move in, it is likely that it will be the end of this term or the start of Term 2.

Please note that contractors will be on site for another few weeks. A safety plan is in place and deliveries will occur outside of busy start and end of the day times.

#### **Introducing Hero**

We are excited to launch our new communication and reporting system, **Hero**, an online sharing platform with a complementary parent app.

We have made this change to Hero for two reasons:

- 1. Hero has a strong Learning focus which will support both teachers, whānau and ākonga in the future.
- 2. Hero will streamline all communication between home and school, providing one way for whānau to access all school and learning information.

Linked here is a letter we sent in January to all whānau about 'Hero' our new learning and student management system. It's a one stop app for whānau and will streamline communication and sharing of information for our school.

#### Settling Into The New School Year

We know that the start of each year can be both exciting and unsettling for our children. For others, it can be a source of anxiety. It's not unexpected to see a few initial 'wobbles' even for children who have previously been really settled. Our staff are working hard to help every ākonga feel safe and like they belong. They will be watching and supporting every child in their whānau class and learning community.

One of the ways whānau can help is to talk about any worries your child has (and also talking about what is going well at school). See if you can come up with any ideas together to help with worries. Sometimes role playing/practicing something can help, for example - asking another child if you can join a game or sit with them.

If you are still concerned about your child settling into school after a few days, please let your child's whānau teacher know or discuss it in your Whānau Connect time in Week 2. Together you can work on supporting your child.

In Jenny Hale's (she's one of our OPS grandmothers) book "Kind, Firm, Calm", she says "If a parent can remain calm and caring, even in the midst of a child's fears, it will go a long way in reassuring the little person that all is well, and that they are going to be ok.". #### Quick Reminders...

#### **Sun Safety**

We promote safety in the sun. Where possible, learning and activities will occur in the shade, however, this is not always possible. This means in Terms 1 and 4, students must wear **school uniform hats** in order to play outside at break times. Children who do not have school hats will play under the trees outside Room 20 or under our new shade structure - in the shade.

School hats can be purchased from our office for \$12, or at The Warehouse Royal Oak. We strongly encourage children to wear their hats to and from school as well.

**Sunscreen** is available in classrooms for children to use. We strongly encourage whānau to apply a good coating of sunscreen in the mornings before school.

Please bring a named drink bottle of water to school every day. We are a water only school at OPS.

#### **Bikes and Scooters**

Please lock your bike or scooter when you leave it at school during the day.

#### **Absences and Attendance**

If your child is going to be away for the day due to sickness, an appointment or any other reason, please notify the school as soon as possible by using the Hero app.

- 1. Click on the 'Report an Absence' icon
- 2. Select the reason for absence (add in any message if you need to)
- 3. Click 'Send Message' and you're done!

#### **Before and After School**

#### Before school arrival

We ask that any children who arrive before 8.20am please go to the hall to Breakfast Club (payment is optional). This means that they are supervised by staff until they are walked into school at 8.20am allowing teachers and other staff to prepare for the day.

You can find out more about before school care at Breakfast Club on our website.

**School gates open at 8.20 am** for ākonga/students and whānau to come into school. Class doors open at 8.20 am. Learning starts when the bell rings at 8.45 am.

**Late arrival -** all ākonga who arrive after the 8.45 am bell rings **MUST** come to our office please so we can sign them in to school. We need to know this to ensure we keep everyone safe and follow up when children do not arrive as expected.

#### After school pick up

Children who have not been collected when our road patrols come in from Arthur or Selwyn Street (approximately 3.10 - 3.15 pm) will be taken to our school office to be safely supervised. We need to move children to this area to keep them safely supervised if whānau are running late.

## **OPS Breakfast Club 2025**

#### Info also available on our OPS Website

The Breakfast Club at Onehunga Primary School supports our OPS whānau in two ways.

- 1. Provide a safe and affordable childcare environment from **7.30 am-8.25 am** for our families with work commitments.
- 2. Offer breakfast to ensure the children can start the learning day with full tummies.

#### Funding Breakfast Club

- We ask for, but do not insist on, a small contribution of \$7 per morning, per child to help cover the cost of the two staff members who run this service.
- · 'Kids Can' provide us with some support for the breakfast items that children eat.
- · Currently the school covers the shortfall of the costs of the staff who run Breakfast Club.

#### **Behaviour Expectations**

All children attending Breakfast Club must follow our school's We CARE philosophy and treat staff and other students with respect. It is an expectation that the children follow the directions of the staff running Breakfast Club.

We ask you to reinforce with your children positive behaviour and choices that are safe and respectful to others whilst they are at Breakfast Club.

Any children who are not meeting expectations for safe and respectful behaviour will not be able to attend.

#### 7.30 am Breakfast Club Start Time.

Breakfast Club occurs in our Hall. **We do not and cannot provide care for children before 7.30am.** Please do not drop your children before this time.

#### **Our Processes**

**Enrolment Form** - To enable us to manage our 'paperwork' around Breakfast Club we ask that families who attend either regularly or casually complete an enrolment form. (See the back of this page).

**Payments** - Where possible we ask that payments are made directly into our bank account: **12-3055-0173711-00** Reference: BCLUB and your child's name. You can also pay by eftpos in our office for multiple days or weeks at once, or pay cash each day to our staff.

**Receipts for Payments** - Receipts will be emailed to families either monthly or at the end of each term with a record of payments made for Breakfast Club attendance.
