Dear Families,

I continue to be overwhelmed by the kind words and support Pond Cove staff have received from parents and families as we approach the one year anniversary of this pandemic. At the same time, many of you have shared your questions and concerns with me. As a community, we know that the safety of everyone is our top priority. However, we are all growing tired of the impact the current safety guidelines have on our ability to invite all students back in the building full time. We hear your voices loud and clear and share those concerns.

As you learned from Dr. Wolfrom's recent letter, an individual associated with Pond Cove School tested positive for COVID-19 earlier this week. Because of the layered safety measures we have in place, we were able to keep our building open with minimal impact to teaching and learning. These safety measures include:

- Health screening by students and staff prior to entering Pond Cove School
- Masking
- Social distancing
- Small cohorts in the classroom and at recess
- Modified allied arts schedule
- Assigned seating in the cafeteria

Pond Cove School continues to examine and follow the guidelines of the Maine Department of Education. At the same time, we monitor what works in our building and brainstorm new ways to adapt should the Maine DOE guidelines change.

We all feel the stress this pandemic is putting on our families and community, and also cannot wait to return to a more normal environment in our schools. I appreciate your continued patience and understanding as we progress through these challenging times.


