Catalog Description: In-depth presentation of a topic of special interest in Physics. Topics will vary from year to year depending on interests, needs, and class level of students and the availability of Physics faculty.

3. Display critical thinking skills via ability to synthesize diverse sources of information
4. Interpret and critically evaluate a wide range of information sources

Brief Outline of Course:

This course permits students to meet with the instructor to consider an agreed upon topic not normally offered as part of the curriculum. Normally, upper division Selected Topics will entail considerably more outside research/reading than do 100 and 200 level courses.
