Play a game of CAT, DOG, PIG or HORSE - If you do not have a basketball hoop or a ball you could use a laundry basket and a sock - Decide together if you will be playing CAT, DOG, PIG or HORSE.. The goal of the activity is to be the last one to spell the word cat or dog. Play rock, paper, scissors to decide who will take their shot first. If you win, you decide where to shoot your ball/sock into the basket.
