

## Hello 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Families!

Happy Friday! We cannot believe we are 5 school days away from summer. We are SO proud of how hard each and everyone of your children grew this year..you should be too! Here is a quick snapshot of what we covered this week:

### Eureka 4: (Grade 4, Module 7)

- **Lesson 13:** Use measurement tools to convert mixed number measurements to smaller units.
- **Lesson 14:** Solve multi-step word problems involving converting mixed number measurements to a single unit.
- **Review & End of Module 7 Assessment**

*This will be the last Module we will cover in 4th grade.*

### Eureka 4/5: (Grade 5, Module 3)

- **End of Module 2 Assessment**
- **Module 3 Lesson 1:** Make equivalent fractions with the number line, the area model, and numbers.
- **Lesson 3 & 4:** Add fractions with unlike units using the strategy of creating equivalent fractions **AND** Add fractions with sums between 1 and 2.
- **Lesson 5 & 6:** Subtract fractions with unlike units using the strategy of creating equivalent fractions. **AND** Subtract fractions from numbers between 1 and 2.

### ELC:

- In Reading, students are working on a variety of projects.
- Please make sure your child returns their literature circle book, as literature circles have wrapped up!
- In Writing, students worked on writing and revising their historical fiction story.

### Benchmark:

- We continued Unit 8: Natural Disasters

- The essential question is: How do Earth's natural processes impact our lives?
- We started researching our own natural disasters and filling out a graphic organizer. We answered questions like:
  - What causes \_\_\_\_\_?
  - How does a \_\_\_\_\_ impact our society?
  - How do you stay safe during a \_\_\_\_\_?
- We will create flip books!
- Students also participated in Reader's Theater

### **Science:**

- We explored more erosion

All 4<sup>th</sup> graders will have nightly math and reading homework. We encourage you to set up a homework spot in your home that is stocked with pencils so that your 4<sup>th</sup> grader is ready to review the day's math concepts. Your child should be reading 20 minutes every night. Math homework goes along with the eureka lessons listed above. Any homework assigned in Science, Social Studies, or Health will be assigned at the teachers discretion.
