

1. The United States of America recognises the the Protectorate of Zion as a independent and sovereign state within the United States of America.
2. The borders of the Protectorate are defined as the lands within the State of New York, State of Connecticut, State of New Jersey, Commonwealth of Massachusetts and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania currently controlled by the Zionist Council of Relief and Resettlement. Any change in those borders will be approved by Congress and The Protectorate of Zion. The State of New Jersey, no longer having a proper state government and currently administered by the Zionist Council of Relief and Resettlement, is declared abolished and extinct as a state.
3. The Protectorate of Zion recognises itself as a part of the United States of America.
4. United States citizens shall enjoy the same rights as Protectorate citizens.
5. The Protectorate of Zion has the same powers given to states as well as the powers over the protectorate's own citizenship, immigration and foreign trade in its own territory.
 - a. The Protectorate has the power to control immigration between itself and foreign nations and the granting of protectorate citizenship to US citizens or foreigners.
 - b. The Protectorate has the power to negotiate separate trade deals with foreign countries.
 - c. The Protectorate has the power to set up embassies and consulates in foreign countries.
 - d. Someone who is a citizen of the Protectorate of Zion and not a U.S. citizen will not eligible for conscription within the confines Selective Service Act, however someone who has dual citizenship of both entities will be eligible for conscription.

(So a US citizen can enter, live and work in Zion but a citizen of Zion who is not also a US citizen cannot do the same. The Protectorate has the right to determine who gets Protectorate citizenship.)

6. The President of the United States shall reserve the right to call up the Armed Forces of Protectorate of Zion for active service to defend the territorial integrity of the United States.
7. For the purpose of representation in Congress and the Electoral College the Protectorate of Zion shall be considered as if it were a state.
8. The Supreme Court of the United States shall be the final court of appeal for federal law in the Protectorate of Zion.
